It shows data stores, management procedures and a variety of web sites through which the public and industry can view or download environmental data.

Maximum re-usability is enabled when appropriate data collection and management standards are used. Science permits also enable future access.

DEWNR curates and manages many of South Australia's authoritative environmental databases. These include collections and data from observations over 100 years ago as well as automated readings collected this morning.

Open data procedures are a critical part of enabling access for everyone. Open data procedures include; identify, classify, license, approve, publish, maintain.

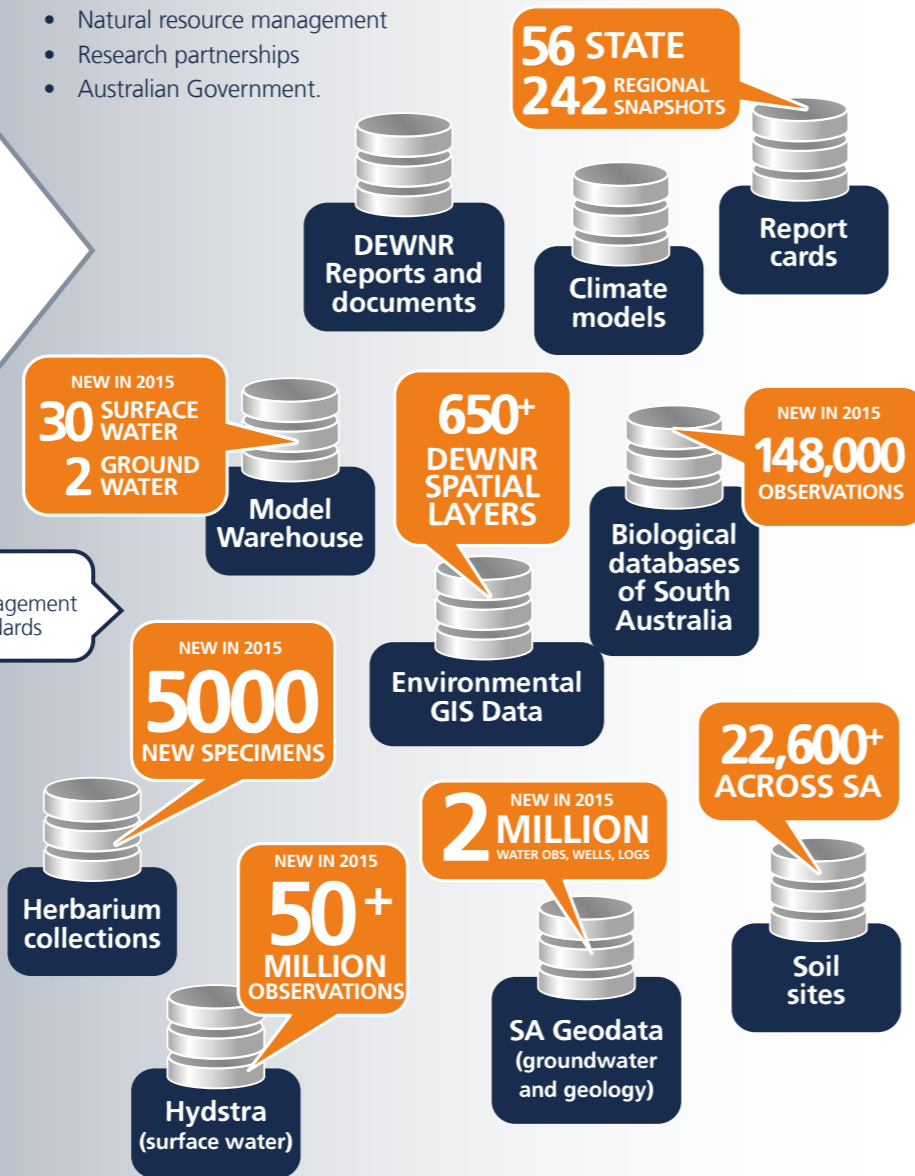

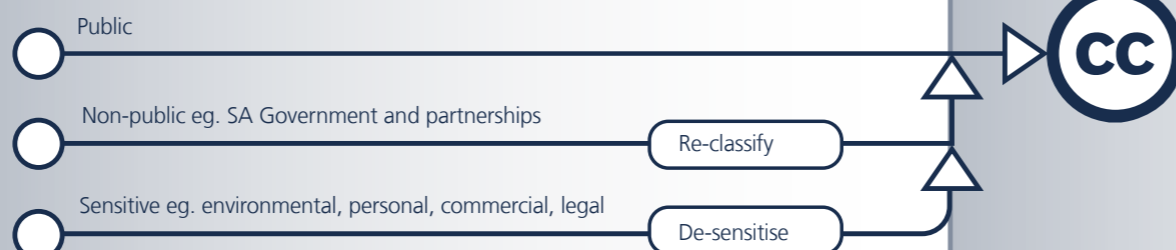
