Tribulus terrestris

AIM: To destroy plants and prevent any further seed set.

Control Options	Chemical	Rate	Comments
Spot Spray	Glyphosate 360	500-700ml/100	
	Glyphosate CT®	400-600ml/100L	Vine and tree crops
	Starane [™] Advanced Herbicide	300ml/100L	Seedlings & young plants to 30cm
	Broadstrike [®]	25g/100L	Rosette stage prior to running
	+ Uptake	500ml/100L	
	Basta®	500ml/100L	Avoid contact with desirable plants.
	Gladiator [®]	400-560ml/100L	Avoid contact with desirable plants.
Boom Spray	Glyphosate CT®	1.6-2.4L/ha	Vine and tree crops
	Metsulfuron-methyl +wetter	5-7g/ha	Short term residual control. Do not use around desirable trees
	Gladiator [®]	1.6-2.4L/ha	Avoid contact with desirable plants.
	Basta®	4-5L/ha	Avoid contact with desirable plants.
Notes	Caltrop does not like competition from other plants.		
	Maintenance of good ground cover will help to significantly reduce the germination of Caltrop.
