Solanum elaeagnifolium

AIM: To destroy plants where possible. Suppress growth and prevent seed set

Control Options	Chemical	Rate	Comments
Spot Spray	Tordon [®] 75D	650ml/100L	Soil residual. Do not use near desirable vegetation. Do not use adjacent to vines.
	Credit [®] + Bonus [®]	1.3L/100L 1.3L/100L	Ensure plants are actively growing. Good spray coverage of plants is required
	Roundup Ready® +Pulse®	1-2kg/100L 200ml/100L	This application should be applied at flowering or berri formation. There may be an advantage in spraying early in the morning when conditions are suitable
	Starane® Advanced herbicide	300ml/100L	Spring to mid summer. Follow up treatment of regrowth is critical for best control.
	Roundup Powermax [®]	870ml or 1.35L/100L	Use higher rate for hand gun and knapsack.
Boom Spray	Roundup Powermax [®]	6L/ha	
Manual Removal	Excavate soil to the depth of the root system, and remove plants. Permission to excavate may be required.		
Mowing/Slashing	Carry out slashing before berry formation. Repeat as required throughout.		
Notes	Control should be carried out before seed set. Plants should be relatively dust free when spraying. Repeated applications may be needed.
