Summary

This report has been prepared as part of the Heritage Conservation Branch's programme of evaluating National Estate items for possible inclusion on the Register of State Heritage Items.

<u>Historically</u>, the Courthouse is an important link in the development of northern provincial Courthouses which, in turn, reflected the Victorian attitudes of law and order.

Architecturally, the Courthouse is a good example of a classically influenced provincial courthouse which emerged from the Architectin-Chief's Department.

Environmentally, the Courthouse is a well-known historical and visual landmark. It is an important element within Hughes Street, which has long been Laura's cultural and administrative centre.

The Integrity of the Courthouse is reasonable with the exterior intact and the interior somewhat altered.

The Courthouse in Laura is Classified by the National Trust and listed on the National Estate Register.

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Laura Courthouse be included on the Register of State Heritage Items and that it be categorized A2, A3, H3.

HISTORICAL RESEARCH: COURT HOUSE - LAURA

Laura is situated approximately thirty kilometres east of Port Pirie within the Hundred of Booyoolie. It was surveyed in 1871 as part of the northern agricultural expansion with "Laura Blocks" being offered for auction in August 1872.

By the end of March of that year, every section adjacent to the town had been selected and Laura soon emerged as an important service and industrial centre so that within two years, blacksmith shops, implement manufactories, a flour mill and a Brewery had been established there. In 1873 John Scott was granted his license to open the "Laura Hotel".

The same year also saw the arrival of Trooper Michael Hurley as the town's first "visiting police officer", to restore law and order. Laura's "permanent" police cells were soon erected in 1875, followed by the police station/residence around 1877 and a Court House in 1878.

Laura's Court House represents an expansion of the central judicial system and is part of the northern circuit for the Supreme Court, a system which had already been provided to the South East since 1862. It is one of a number of similarly designed free standing (as opposed to physically linked with a police station), courthouses, where diversity was often achieved by varying the classical ornamentation to the front porch and facade.
