HERITAGE SIGNIFICANCE

RECOMMENDATION: State

Description:

The structures are connected. An old stone sheepyard wall leads to the partly demolished shearing shed, connected to the Shearers' Quarters. Of faced sandstone construction, limewashed, some granite lintels over sub-floor vent openings. Imported milled timber in roof trusses. Windows Quarters six paned with ledged doors and hipped iron roof. Quarters of Georgian proportions and in fairly original condition.

'Henry Scott went into a large pastoral venture in the Ninety Mile Desert in partnership with Douglas Gooch, his brother-in-law. Their wool shed was at Cold and Wet. The experiences here were found to be quite different from those associated with the industry in the far north. They were indeed bitter experiences in this southern country, and after several years Henry Scott gave up the Cold and Wet venture after losing many thousands of pounds in the business, which was a veritable cold and wet experience financially' (R. Cockburn). Henry Scott had a distinguished career in South Australian pastoralism and politics.

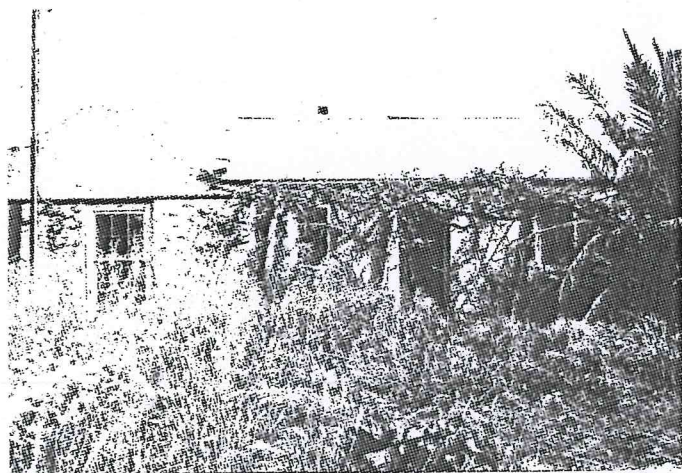

HERITAGE SIGNIFICANCE

RECOMMENDATION: State

Description:

Random rubble stonework with corrugated galvanized iron hipped roof. 'T' shaped building with 16 stands along the head and lower wool room in the tail. Massive oregon roof framing with a 200 mm. x 200 mm. beam at T-junction. Roman numerals on roof framing to identify each element in relation to each other. Main joists are single lengths of oregon. Low stone dwarf walls in wool room (floor boards missing). Timber lintels to openings and timber fascia boards around building. Pen fittings and gratings are of sawn red gum.

The roof timbers carry the initials 'H & B', for Harding and Bunn, for whom the shearing shed was built. 'It is one of the best sheds in the South East' (R. Cockburn). The original owners of the station were T.W. and J.H. Boothby, but William Harding and George Bunn effected the major improvements. They at one time held hundreds of square miles of land and ran 40,000 sheep at "Tintinara". William Harding was buried near the shed in 1874.

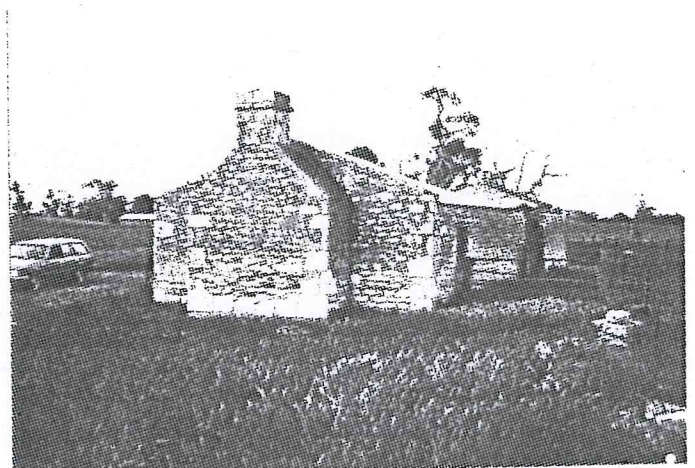

Random rubble stonework with corrugated galvanized iron gable ended roof. Timber lintels over door and small windows. Stone chimney with large timber lintel over fireplace (badly burnt). Rough plastered walls with newspaper cuttings pasted on to the interior walls of one room. Arched stonework lintel over southern door and large stone block quoins to doors and windows. Ceilings unlined.

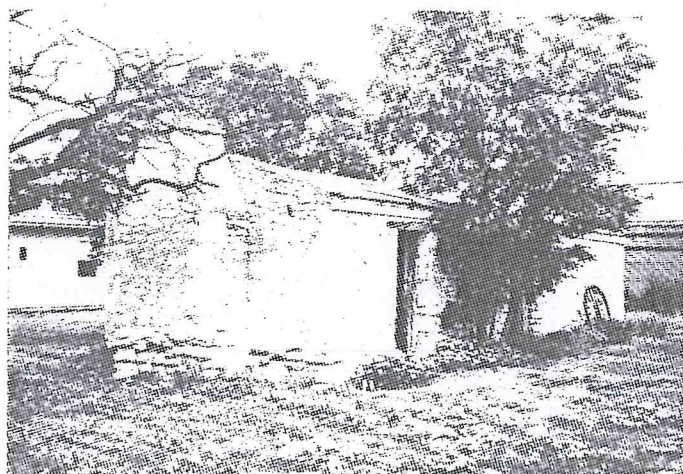

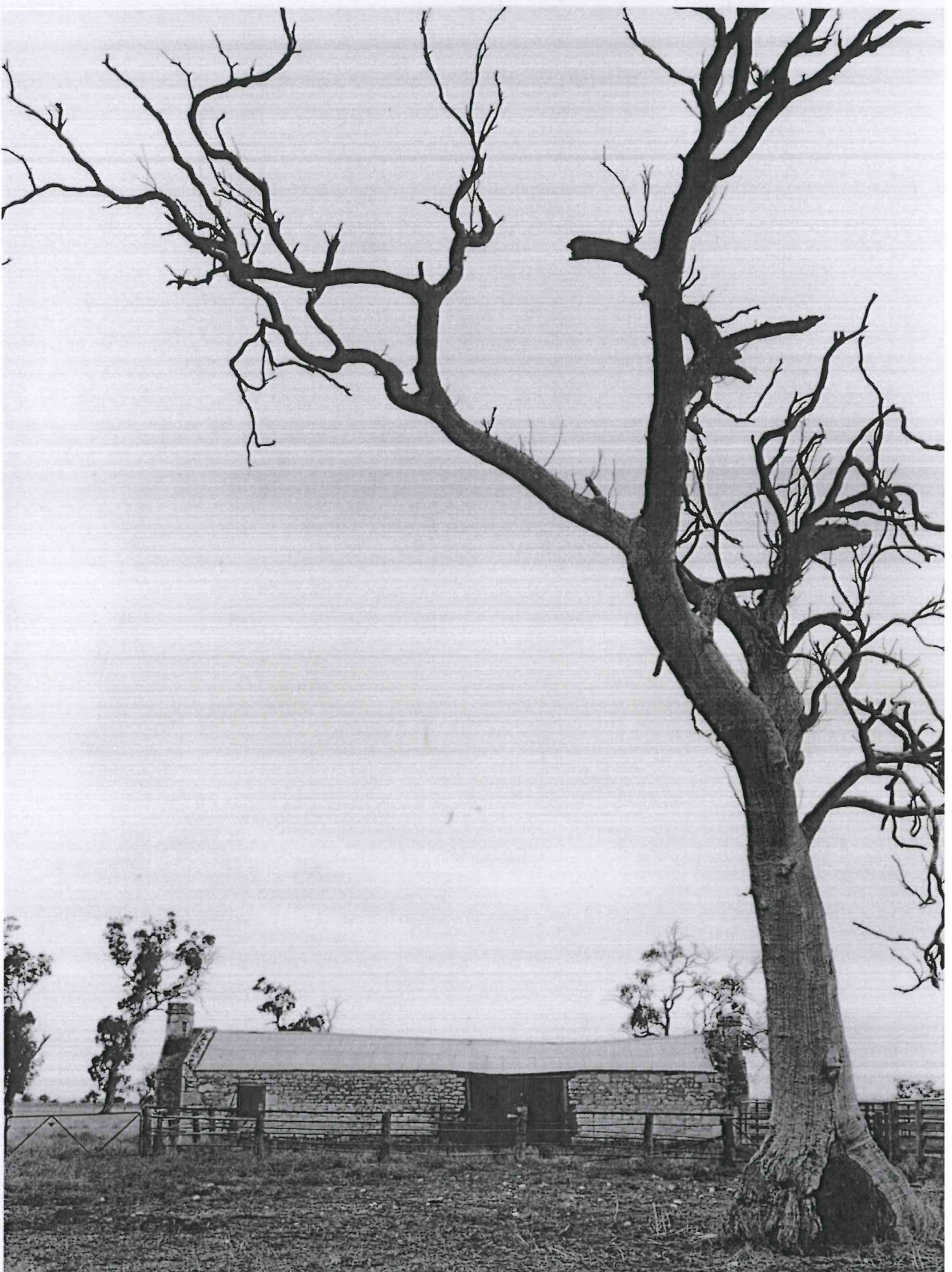
