Description:

Random rubble stonework with paling extension. Steeply pitched pyramid-shaped corrugated galvanized iron roof. Dressed limestone quoins. Basement entered from under side elevation. Lean-to extension on south-east elevation.

Hop growing began in the Yahl district in the 1870's and continued with limited success until the early years of this century. This building was also used for church services.

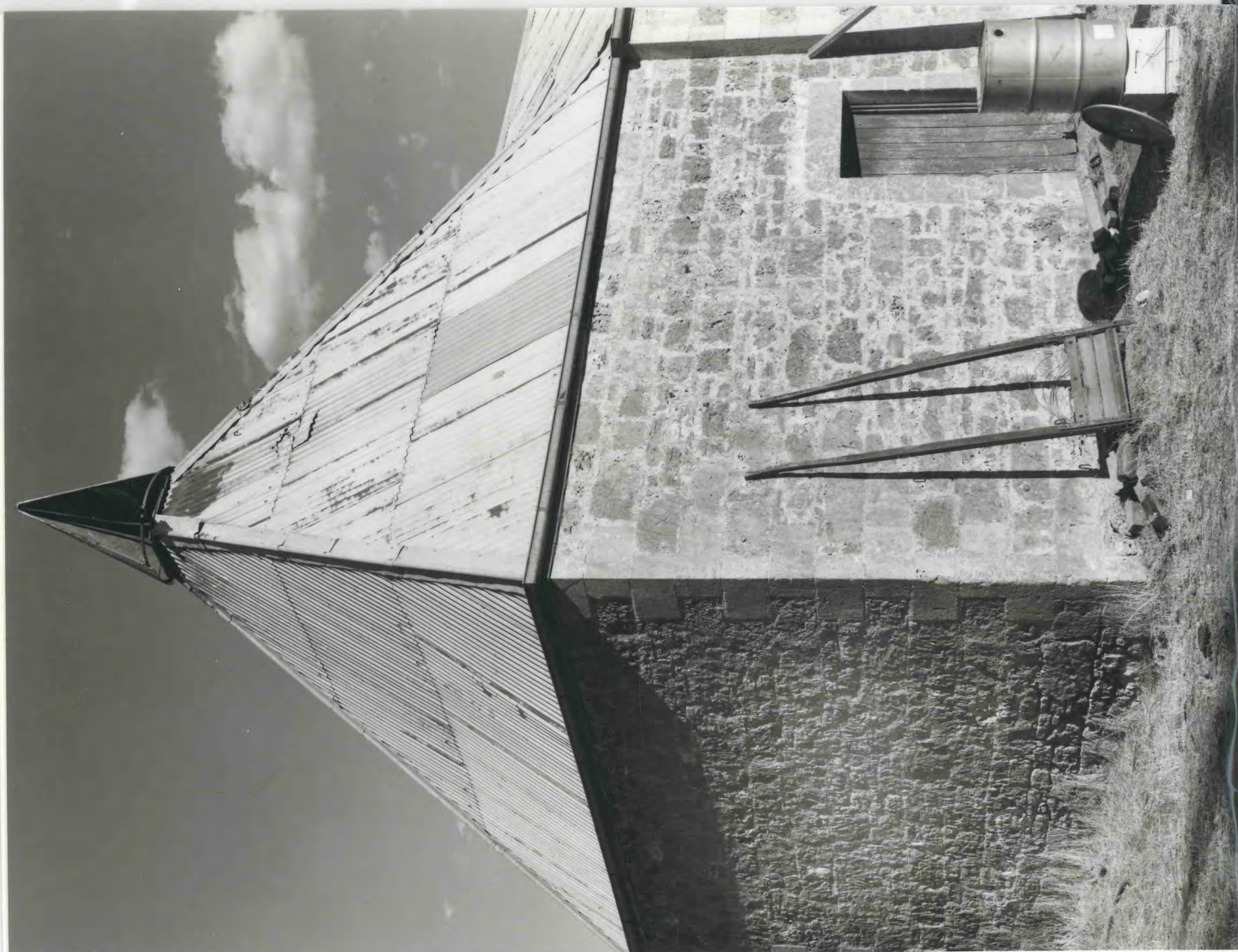

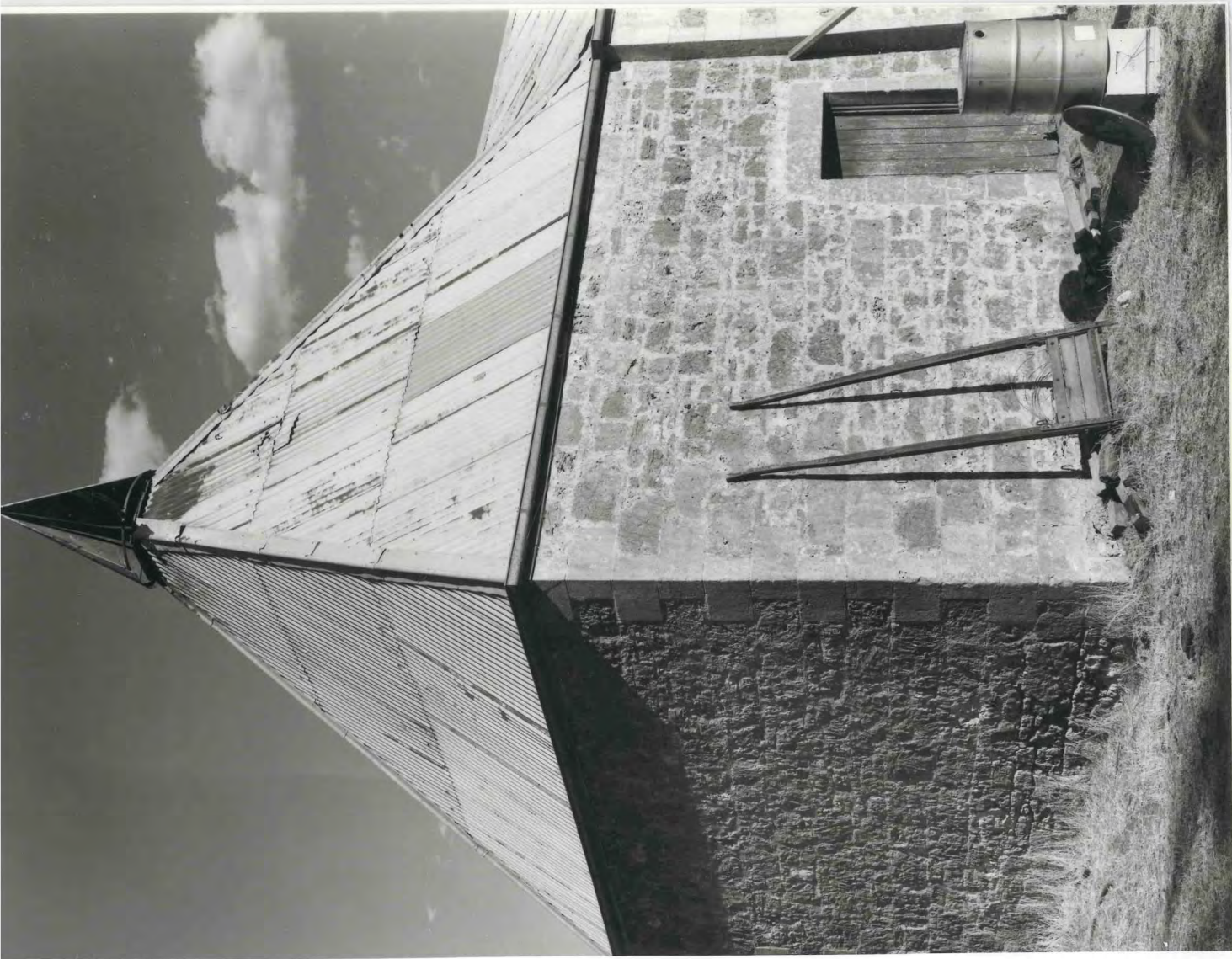
