
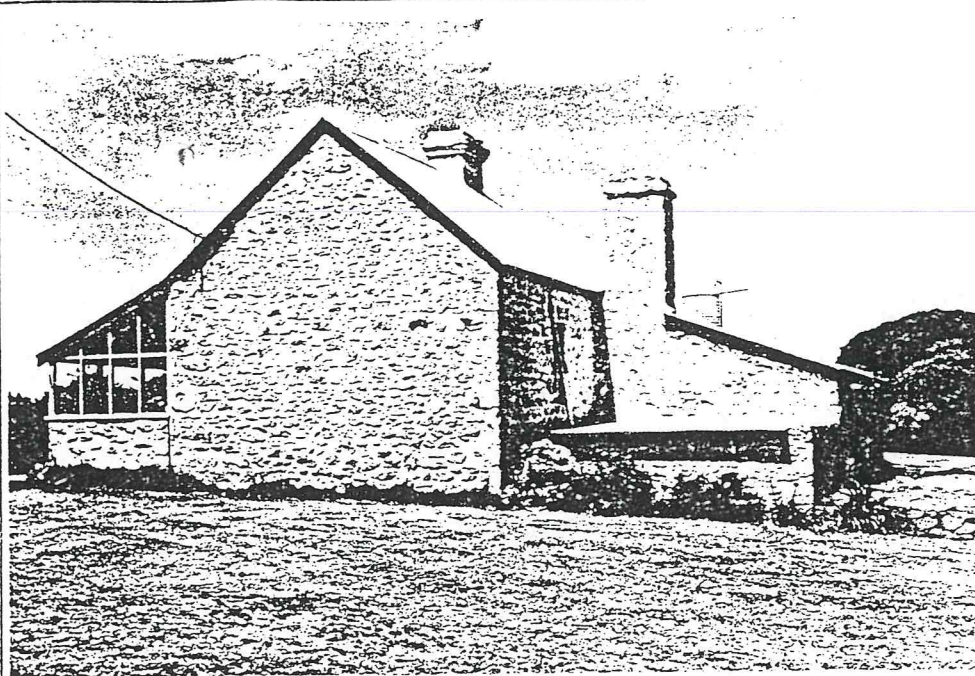


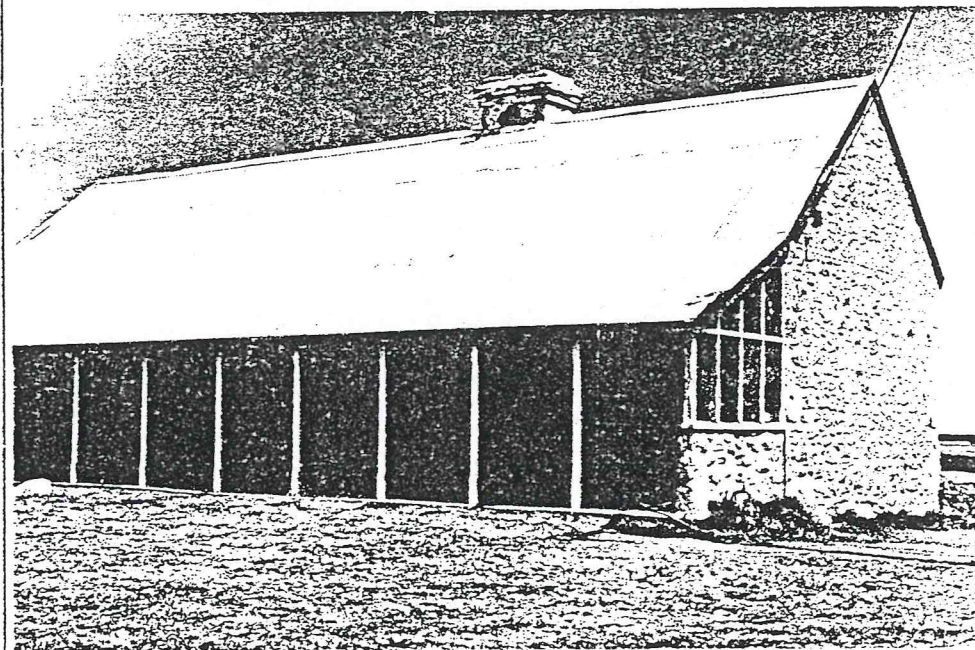

<p>HERITAGE SIGNIFICANCE Poltalloch Station is one of the most significant of those stations situated about Lake Alexandrina. It was originally part of the Special Survey which was taken out by Neil Malcolm in August 1839, though it was not surveyed until 1841. The property passed to John Malcolm in 1857, who continued his brother's policy of adding land to the station whenever possible.</p> <p>The whole of the estate was sold to the Bowman Brothers in 1874 when they disbanded their partnership, Poltalloch went to John Bowman. Construction began at the new Poltalloch site in 1875, but it was not until 1879 that work began on the Homestead. Substantial additions to the homestead and the complex were made in 1909 and 1911. The woolshed with its distinctive galvanized iron vaulted roof which was built in 1875 had accommodation for 22 shearers, and in 1904 26,000 sheep were shorn. The buildings of the complex are very extensive and they demonstrate a high degree of integrity and originality. The significance of the grand two-storey homestead is considerably enhanced by the formal garden which is associated with it. The complex admirably demonstrates the functions of a large pastoral station. 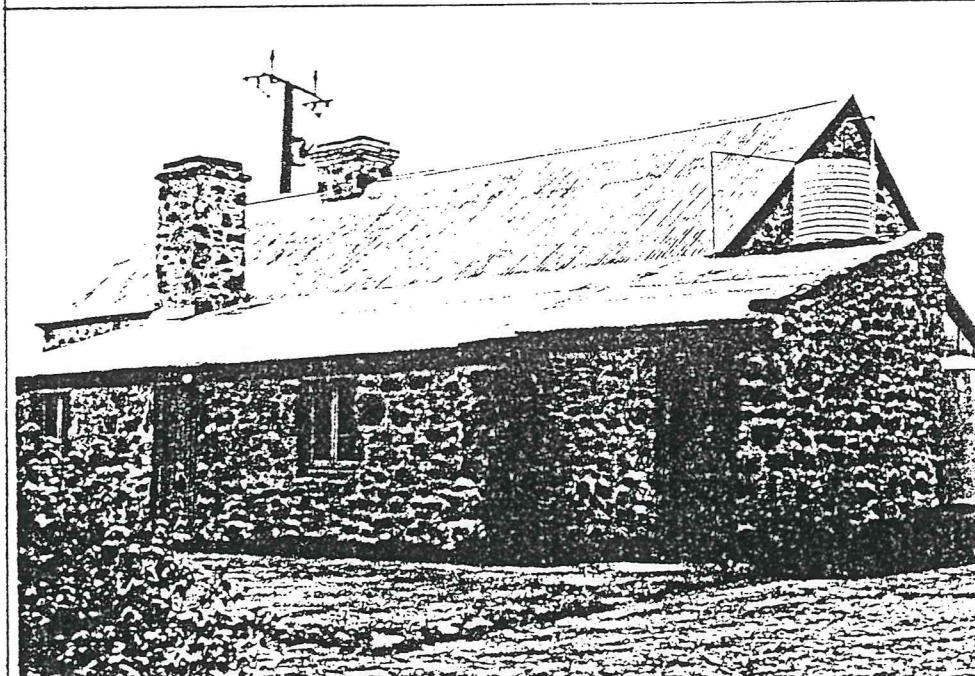

HERITAGE SIGNIFICANCE

This substantial homestead was the first homestead and manager's residence of the famous Poltalloch station and probably dates from the 1840s.

Poltalloch station was originally taken up as a special survey by Neil Malcolm in 1839. When his plan to bring out Scottish peasants to settle the land failed, he stocked it with cattle which were overlanded from Port Fairy by Joseph Hawdon. Poltalloch became a part of the extensive holdings of the Malcolms in the Lake district. The property passed to the Bowman brothers in 1874. A new homestead was built by John Bowman in 1879 (see item no. 44) 6km to the west of the original homestead.

The house is a fine vernacular example of the earliest use of local limestone. Some of the internal walls are of "wattle and daub" construction (native pine posts with lathes and daub) and the roofing structure is of red gum and Callitris pine.

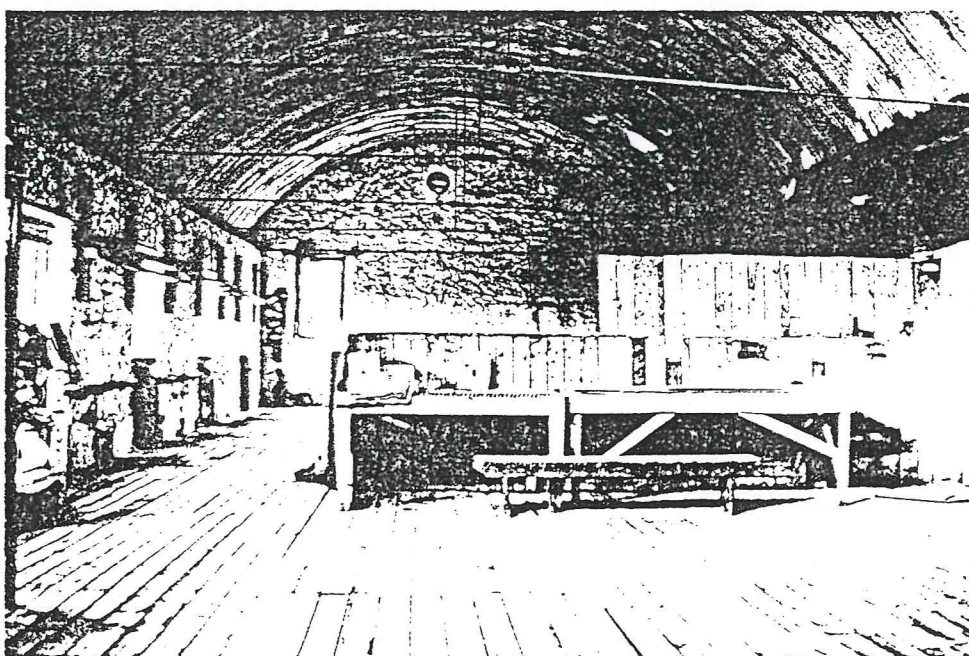
