Description:

Gabled building of rendered stone with sash windows, semi-circular fanlight over double doors, raked verandah. Adjacent bungalow of rendered stone has stone quoins to single-paned sash windows. Partially enclosed return verandah under main roof, stone chimney with string courses.

Charles Todd's Overland Telegraph from Adelaide to Melbourne passed through Robe, where an Intercolonial Telegraph Station was built.

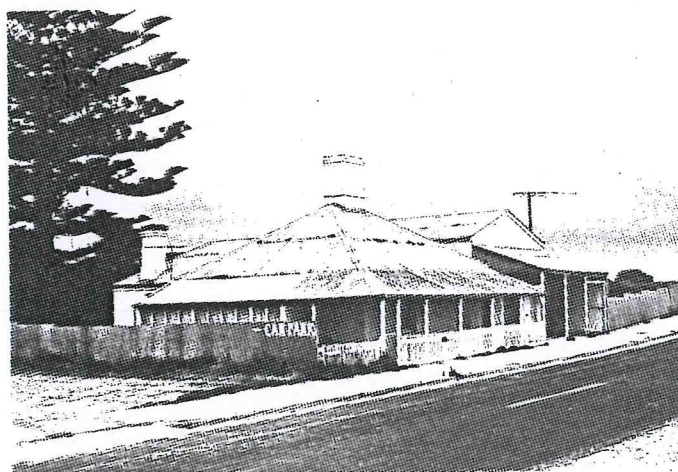
