HERITAGE SIGNIFICANCE

RECOMMENDATION: State

Description:

Corrugated galvanized iron hipped roof continuous with hipped main roof. Rubble walls with brick quoins to six-paned sash windows and doors with three-paned skylight over. Part parapet wall frontage, rendered without quoins. Timber tracery to verandah structure. Group of small older buildings to the rear, of rubble walls with three-paned casement windows and timber lattice to gable.

The larger room was built for George Ormerod 'to accommodate wool salvaged from the wreck of the "Duilius" in 1853' (National Trust). Late owners included D. Grosse, who made it "London House", a millinery and dressmaking establishment, Robert Affleck, and the Savage family. It was the last home of Kathleen Bermingham, historian of Robe.

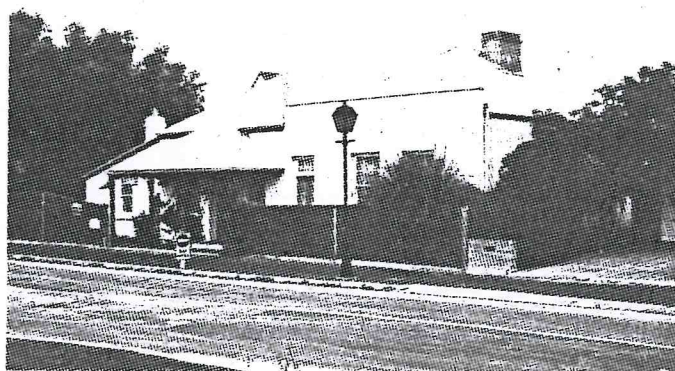

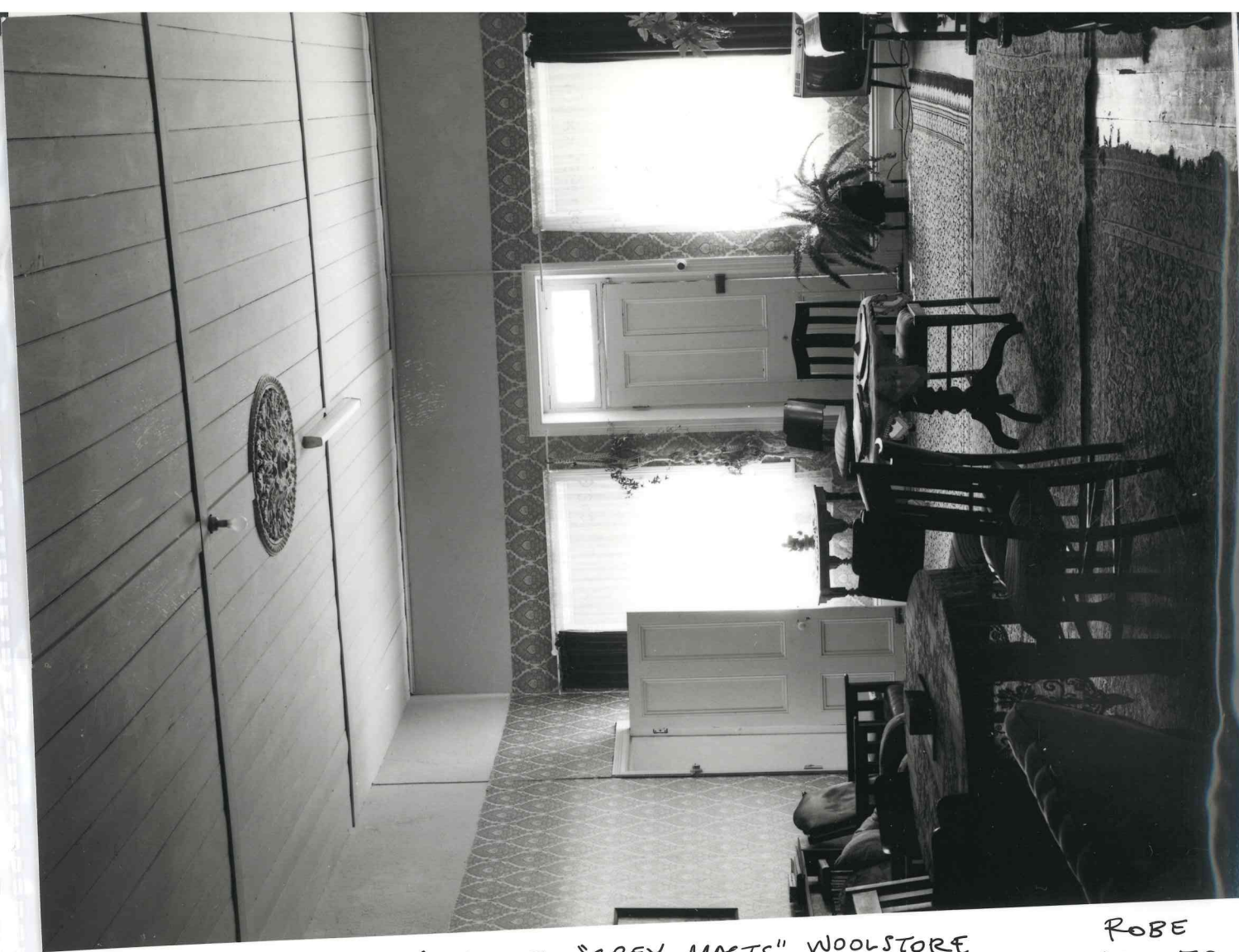
