

	HISTORY, DESCRIPTION AND SIGNIFICANCE It appears that the Onkaparinga District Council first recommended the establishment of a police station and court of limited jurisdiction at Woodside in July 1854. A copy of this resolution was sent to the Colonial Secretary, but discussion continued over the next few years and it was not until 1859 that the courthouse was erected at a cost of £750. The nearby stables were built in the following year, and the courthouse was extended in 1864. Sited well back from the Main Street with a cell block in the foreground, the courthouse is of a classical design with an early Victorian 'cottage ornee' police station at the rear. The courthouse was built of squared freestone while the police station was built of random stonework with dressed, squared quartzitic stone to the window and door surrounds. The stable was built of coursed sandstone rubble with brick surrounds to the openings, while the twin cell block is of freestone with rendered detailing.
