

In 1844 this wind-driven flour mill was built be F. R. Nixon on Windmill Hill, near Mount Barker in the Adelaide hills. It ground local grain until 186-

The first water-driven flour mill in South Austral was erected at Bridgewater, in the Adelaide hills, 1860. The wheel was constructed in Glasgow, ar has a diameter of thirty-six feet. It used 6,500 gallor of water per minute—equal to seventeen to pressure—supplied from a dam built in Cox's Crei in 1859. The mill still stands, but has not turned f many years.
