

RAILWAY BRIDGE, WATSON'S GAP, VIA VICTOR HARBOUR.

HERITAGE SIGNIFICANCE

Historically - The item in its present form reflects the continued development and relative prosperity of the region in the early 20th century.

Architecturally the bridge is an unusual concrete structure with a parabolic arch, reputed to be the first of its kind in Australia.

Environmentally, the bridge is a striking feature in the landscape.

The Integrity of the bridge is excellent, with very little deterioration.

NOMINATION SOURCE/THREAT/OWNER

This report has been prepared in response to a recommendation by the South Australian Heritage Committee on 30 May, 1984 that the entire Victor Harbor-Goolwa Railway be assessed for the Register. The item is owned by Australian National Railways. The future of services on the line is in doubt, but the bridge is not known to be under any threat.

No potential for adaptation.

Item

Interpretive measures need to be part of a strategy for the Victor Harbor railway as a whole, depending on whether or not it continues to operate.

History and Sources

Throughout the year of 1852, the lieutenant Governor, Sir Henry Young, successfully waged his campaign to establish a Harbor and Tramway complex on the South Coast to handle goods for the colony from interstate and overseas. The choice of natural anchorage/harbor site was limited to two stretches of water, one being Rosetta Head at Victor Harbor, the other Port Elliot.

A Harbormaster had been previously dispatched to the region with orders to assess both sites and make recommendations pertaining to the more suitable one. His report was attached to Sir Henry Young's final submission to Earl Grey, Secretary of State for the Colonies, and advised on the relative merits of both potential harbor sites in the following manner: "As a great objection to the former (Rosetta Head), I would remark with the winds most prevalent, it would be extremely difficult to take craft sufficiently close to obtain shelter under the bluff", and, "experience has shown this place to be totally unsafe. Port Elliot, on the contrary, is easy of approach and sheltered against all winds.... Indeed it is my opinion that Port Elliot will be proved the safest anchorage (except Port Lincoln) on the South line of the Province".

This final project proposal was received favourably by Earl Grey and his superiors, and as a result, the Port Elliot Harbor complex and associated Tramway to Goolwa became a reality. Shipping loss in the following decade however, highlighted the gross miscalculations of the Harbor Master, and it was accordingly decided to develop Victor Harbor after all as the South Coast's major harbor. Estimates were drawn up in 1861, and the wharf/tramway extensions put to tender.

A bridge to provide for transport over Watsons Gap, 2-1/2 miles east of Victor Harbor, was one of the major priorities of the scheme, and the government first advertised the tender on January 5th, 1863. Three replies were received by the Public Works Department, a Mr. R. Redman being the successful applicant, and on February 4th of the same year, the contract to lay rail lengths, complete all necessary earthworks, erect a goods warehouse, passenger shed, bonded cellar at Victor Harbor and construct the bridge over Watsons Gap, was signed and witnessed. In the early days of December 1863, the bridge was completed.

History and Sources

On the 1st April, 1864, the 4 mile 30 chain rail length extension to Victor Harbor was opened to traffic, and four months later was officially opened by Mr. Dodson, Chairman of the Encounter Bay District Council.

The finished structure evoked much admiring comment, including references to its "beauty of design, great strength and gracefulness of appearance". Spanning 290 feet, the bridge's decking rested on 8 main and 4 abutment pylons, the former trussed and the latter braced for greater stress resistance. The structure stood 27 feet above common roadway, supported overall by iron shod piles buried to a depth of 15 to 17 feet. reputedly, 45,000 lineal feet of hardwood were used in construction.

The next reference to the bridge was after its completion dates from 1872 when the decking was re-tarred.

In 1905-6 the Railways department made a decision to replace the light locomotives at that time servicing the Strathalbyn/Victor Harbor link with new R.RX and N class locos. The timber bridge at Watsons Gap was deemed inadequate to carry the weight of these machines over any sustained period of time, and as a result it was dismantled with the intention of erecting a concrete replacement.

In the annual report of the Railway Commissioner for the year 1906-7, the new ferro concrete bridge is reported completed, and as a single arch structure, it was unique in the State, possibly Australia wide.

As an engineering curiosity, the bridge attains special significance for the extremely uneconomical use of concrete/iron in its construction. An arched bridge's construction cost can be greatly reduced by eliminating structurally unnecessary material used in the spandrels. The designer/s of the Watsons Gap bridge were obviously unacquainted with this revelation, otherwise tons of concrete and iron re-inforcing would have been trimmed from the projects budget.

Chronology

11th February, 1850, Harbor Master's Report to Sir Henry Young. The years 1852-53 - Goolwa/Pt. Elliot tramway constructed. The year 1861 - Debates concerning proposal to construct Harbor and Tram extension to Victor Harbor. January 5th, 1863 - Tender advertised for Watsons Gap bridge and Victor Harbor Pier/tram station. February 4th 1863 - Contract signed by Mr. R. Redman for above projects. December 1863 - Watsons Gap bridge completed. April 1st 1864 - Victor Harbor extension opened to traffic. August 4th, 1864 - Victor Harbor extension officially opened by Chairman of Encounter Bay D.C. Year of 1872 - Bridge decking re-tarred. 1905-06 - Proposal for new locomotives to service Strathalbyn/Victor Harbor line. Year of 1906 - Wooden bridge dismantled. 1906-07 - New ferro concrete bridge completed.





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SOUTH AUSTRALIAN HERITAGE ACT, 1978

Entry of Items on the Register of State Heritage Items

There has been an increased community awareness of the need to protect those buildings and leatures of our State which reflect our cultural heritage. The South Australian Government has recognised that awareness by passing the South Australian Heritage Act, 1978, for which the Minister for Environment and Planning is responsible. In accordance with the provisions of the Act, the Register of State Heritage Items is being compiled.

Where the Minister considers that an item (defined as any land, building or structure) that is not on the Register is part of the physical, social or cultural heritage of the State and that the item is of significant aesthetic, architectural, historical or cultural interest, then the Minister may enter that item on the Register.

Pursuant to the provisions of the South Australian Heritage Act, 1978, I, Don Hopgood. Minister for Environment and Planning and Minister for the time being administering the said Act, hereby give notice that I have entered on the Register of State Heritage Items the items described in the schedule hereunder.

Items listed as the schedule were previously placed on an Interim List in accordance with the provisions of section 15 of the South Australian Heritage Act, 1978. Excepting items owned by the Crown and those within the area of the corporation of the city of Adelaide, the remaining items listed in The Schedule are subject to Part V of the Planning Act, 1982. That Act requires that no development, including demolition, conversion, alteration of, or addition to any item, is permitted without the written consent of the relevant Planning Authority. Items within the area of the corporation of the city of Adelaide are subject to the provisions of the City of Adelaide Development Control Act, 1976.
