## HERITAGE SIGNIFICANCE

<u>Historically</u>, this item is significant for its association with the early growth of the Foresters' Lodge, and the development of urban social institutions in the lower north.

Architecturally, the building is typical of simple country 'Hall' buildings but it does illustrate a high standard of stone detailing on its exterior. The interior is notable for its applied decoration.

Environmentally, this item contributes to the character of early Watervale, its location on the Main North Road expressing the town's function as a stopping-place and agricultural service centre.

The Integrity of the item is fair. Alterations have been made to adapt the building to a continuing role, but fortunately these are either superficial or visually non-disruptive.

## NOMINATION SOURCE/THREAT/OWNER


