Blackberry

Rubus fruticosus

AIM: To destroy plants to prevent further propagation

Control Options	Chemical	Rate	Comments
Spot Spray	Glyphosate 360	1/1.3L/100L	Spray plant when actively growing. Ensure complete spray coverage.
	Garlon 600 [®]	170ml/100L	
	Grazon DS [®]	350-500ml/100L	Late Spring to Autumn
	Credit [®] + Bonus [®]	670-900ml/100L 670-900ml/100L	Apply from flowering to leaf fall
	Brushoff [®] + Glyphosate 360 + wetter	10g/100L 200ml/100L	Apply Jan - April when bushes are actively growing
	Roundup Biactive [®]	1-1.3L/100L	
	Trounce [®] + Pulse [®]	1 x 173g/100L 50ml/100L	Apply from flowering until prior to leaf yellowing
Boom Spray	Trounce [®] + Pulse [®]	20 x 173g/ha 100ml/100L	Apply from flowering until prior to leaf yellowing
	Garlon 600 [®]	4.8L/ha	
	Grazon DS [®]	10L/ha	
Mowing / Slashing	Slashing will not kill Blackberry however will improve the results of follow up herbicide treatment. Regrowth needs to be approximately 0.5-1 m high before undertaking follow up spraying.		
Grazing	Grazing with goats at high stocking rates can be used to control Blackberry in pastures but their use must be continuous to prevent regrowth occurring.		
Notes	Due to widespread picking of blackberries by the public, it is recommended that herbicides are not applied to bushes bearing mature fruit.
