Gorse

Ulex europaeus

AIM: To destroy plants to prevent further seed set and propagation

Control Options	Chemical	Rate	Comments
Spot Spray	Brushoff [®] +Glyphosate +Pulse [®]	10g/100L 200ml/100L 200ml/100L	
	Grazon [®] DS +wetter	250-350ml/100L 100ml/100L	500mls Grazon [®] DS for winter treatment.
	Roundup Biactive [®] +Pulse	1L/100L 200ml/100L	
	Credit [®] +Bonus [®] +Penetrant	670ml/100L 670ml/100L	Apply when actively growing
	Garlon [®] 600 +wetter	170-340ml/100L 125ml/100L	
	Weedmaster Duo [®] + Penetrant	1L/100L	
	Trounce [®] + Pulse	1 x 173g /100L 100ml/100L	
	Mowing / Slashing	Slashing will not kill Gorse however may improve the results of follow up herbicide treatment. Regrowth needs to be approximately 0.5-1 m high before undertaking follow up spraying.	
Burning	Fire can be useful in reducing dense thickets of Gorse to allow follow-up spraying of regrowth. Would recommend to contact your local CFS before undertaking any burning of Gorse.		
Notes	Follow-up treatment of any re-growth may be required
