

INTRODUCTION


This report was compiled by Annette Green the Centre's consultant architect with the assistance of Annely Aeuckens the Centre's consultant historian for the first phase of the Onkaparinga district heritage survey (1982-1983). Apart from the material prepared here, these exists a substantial body of material related to the survey prepared by Annely Aeuckens and Jane Sear an historian who also worked on the project in 1983. This includes a history of the settlement of the area in relation to Wakefield's theories of migration, a brief history of the dairying industry, a detailed chronology from 1840 to 1870, and material dealing with the South Australian Company. This will all be combined with further studies at presently being carried out by Dr. Debra Jordan the Centre's new consultant historian and Peter Perkins its new consultant architect. It includes a continuation of the detailed chronology, a brief history of the brewing industry, township profiles (history and townscape assessments) and detailed measured drawing studies of important historical buildings.

The District Council of Onkaparinga has been divided into ten distinctive areas for the study. These also incorporate the major town of the area Lobethal, which with its environs were previously surveyed by the Centre in 1980-82. The areas are as follow:

- 3. Inverbrackie
- 4. Woodside


ONKAPARINGA SURVEY : MAP AREA & LOCATION

ONKAPARINGA SURVEY: MAP 2 HERITAGE AREAS

This area was the subject of a detailed heritage survey carried out by the South Australian Centre For Settlement Studies for the South Australian Department of Environment and Planning during 1981-82, and published under the title Lobethal 'Valley of Praise' in 1983. The first part of this survey dealt with the history and early buildings of the township of Lobethal, which was laid out by German settlers as a farmlet village (Hufendorf) in 1842. Within two decades of the settlement of Lobethal the surrounding farming areas of Neudorf, Schoenthal and Tabor Valley were established and these formed the basis of a wider study of the Lobethal environs. The other centre of German settlement within the northern portion of the Onkaparinga Council district is Springhead, a separate community which developed around its own Luthern Church and school, and the survey was completed by a comparative study between this and the nearby English settlemment of Charleston. Each of these areas revealed a wealth of physical evidence from the early settlement period of the district and a list of the heritage items identified have been included Many of these items represent the traditional building on pages techniques employed by German settlers throughout the state and include excellent examples of both half-timbered and substantial stone dwellings of this type. The outbuildings associated with these are also well represented and include a variety of above ground cellars, farm buildings and an important example of an external bake-oven and smoke house. of the most interesting houses identified in Lobethal is No. 5 Woodside Road which is a fully timbered two room cottage with elaborate external timber panelling suggesting craftsmanship of a high order. Other buildings of particular importance include an extended gable house (Giebellauben) which is located to the north-east of Lobethal, an intact hop kiln at Neudorf and a two storey cob farmhouse and cob outbuildings near Charleston, the latter being a unique South Australian example of a traditional Deveonshire farm complex.





AREA TWO - BALHANNAH

Balhannah was the first township to be subdivided in the district, with allotments being advertised for sale at the end of 1839, and the Balhannah Inn being licensed in the following year. The subdivision which had been laid out by James Thomson, did not prove a success and the allotments were mostly combined to form larger holdings - a fate shared by the adjoining subdivisions of Gilleston and Blyth Town which were laid out in the 1850's.

An adjoining area, subdivided in the mid 1970's has attracted considerable interest, but the original core of the town was never fully developed and has retained an open, semi-rural character. Three buildings within this core area form an interesting precinct which illustrates the range of services provided by the early township. The Golden Cross Hotel, which is located on the intersection between the Onkaparinga Valley Road and Junction Street, was originally licensed in 1850, and the facade of this simple, single storey building has retained an attractive nineteenth century character which greatly enhances the streetscape. Opposite this is St. Thomas' Anglican Church which was built here in 1865, on the site of an earlier Anglican Church erected in the early 1850s. Of a rather whimsical, eclesiastical design this forms another attractive corner element which, in conjuction with the adjoining cemetery, is of considerable local significance. The third element of this group is the former Balhannah school which was built on land donated by Osmond Gilles in the subdivision of Gilleston. In 1857 the town's first school was described as being 'small and excessively crowded' and the substantial new school and residence erected in the following year remains as a tribute to the importance placed on education by both the local community and the state authorities.

In 1883 Balhannah was linked with Adelaide by rail and for many years the local station remained an important railway centre for the district. The town also became a centre for small industries and this is illustrated by the Balhannah Cheese and Butter Factory which opened in 1894. In 1914 this function was enhanced by the establishment of Australia's first private cold store designed for fruit storage, and the original store is still being used by the Balhannah Co-operative Society Pty. Ltd.




The site includes a large turn of the century house which was built of bluestone with red brick detailing. Although the walls have since been rendered the external appearance of the building is still relatively intact. The roof is an unusual lantern style with a cast iron frieze and cresting. A wide verandah completely surrounds the house and this has been finished with cast iron detailing. To insulate the house a layer of chicken wire was spread over the ceiling joists and this was covered first with a layer of newspapers (dated 1903) and then with a 100 mm thick layer of seaweed.

The factory, which is now used as a garage, was built of random bluestone with brick detailing, a second room being added at a later date. The front wall has been removed, but some of the pulley machinery is still intact — this originally having been linked to the pump and bricklined well which are located outside. A later cold room built of cavity brickwork, lined with timber and insulated with charcoal is now in a deteriorated condition.


Near the factory there is another bluestone building with brick detailing, and this originally consisted of four small rooms used to accommodate workers. A large window has been added to the facade, but at least one of the rooms is still intact.

This property reflects the development of the dairy industry in the district during the latter part of the 19th century, and is an important example of the secondary industries being developed at this time.

HISTORY, DESCRIPTION AND SIGNIFICANCE

The first school in Balhannah was opened by Henry Fenwick in 1851 on a site within the original subdivision of Balhannah (Section 4208). In 1857 a report was submitted to the Onkaparinga District Council describing this building as small and excessively crowded, and at about the same time the Balhannah School Committee approached the Central Board of Education with plans for a new building to be erected on Section 4022. Some debate ensued about the suggested site and it was eventually agreed that the new school should be built on an allotment set aside for this purpose by Osmond Gilles, in the new subdivision of Gilleston (Section 4014). The school and attached residence was completed in November 1858 at a cost of £395, and it continued to be used until the consolidated School at Oakbank was opened in 1938. Since this time the building has been used as a residence.

The school and residence were built of random stone with sawn stone voussoirs, quoins and corbelled gable detailing. The former school has lancet P.T.O.





AREA THREE - INVERBRACKIE

Inverbrackie was a farming area established by Scottish settlers around the Inverbrackie Creek. The oldest remaining building in this area is the old Inverbrackie Hotel which was licenced by J. Payne between 1846 and 1851. This would have been one of the few public buildings in the district at this time, and in 1846 it was used for a meeting of Scottish settlers which led to the erection of the Caledonian Church at Inverbrackie in 1848. The ruins of this church are located adjacent to the cemetery. and the former manse, built in 1857, is situated nearby. Despite the early importance of Inverbrackie as a rural centre it was never subdivided as a town, its development being overshadowed after the subdivision of Woodside at the beginning of the 1850s. The name Inverbrackie was adopted by the army camp which was established here in 1927, and this has continued as an important training centre until the present day. The land it occupies was the site of the 'Elderslie' homestead, built in 1856 by Alexander Lorimer, a Scottish settler who was one of the major landholders in the district during the early settlement period. Andrew Murdoch, Lorimer's partner in many of these land deals, occupied the nearby homestead of 'Craigdarroch', but unfortunately neither building has survived. The tenancy records for the South Australian company show that one of the Johnstons was living in a substantial house near Inverbrackie during the 1840s, but this has also been lost and there is little remaining evidence of the type of houses occupied by the original Scottish settlers in this area.

The area referred to as Inverbrackie in the early assessment records of the Onkaparinga Council District lies generally to the north east of the former church and hotel.

The other item of significance in this area is the old flour mill on the Onkaparinga Valley Road. This was located on land owned by the South Australian Company and was first established in 1850. It was only used as a mill for 10-15 years, but while there were a number of mills operating in the district during the 1850's this is the only remaining example. Although it has since been occupied as a house the original structure is still easily identifiable and it remains an important remnant of one of the earliest rural industries in the district.

The hotel was the first point of focus for the development of the Scottish community of Inverbrackie - and was closely associated with the nearby Inverbrackie Church. Although this area failed to develop as a town centre (the township of Woodside being laid out instead) it has retained its own identity and the old hotel, along with the former church and manse, form the core of this locality.


The first minister appointed to the Inverbrackie Church, the Rev. John MacBean, did not arrive from Scotland until 1852. By this time Paynes Inn had closed and the building was then used as the manse. In 1857 it was again determined that a manse should be erected and subscriptions were made to the extent of nearly £350. Mr. Ephram Weymouth's tender of £475 was accepted, but it was a number of years before the building was completed.

By 1878 the accommodation at the Inverbrackie Church had proved inadequate and the Lutheran Church in Woodside was purchased and renamed St. Johns Presbyterian Church (Item Ref. No.4.13). However, the manse remained at Inverbrackie until 1921 when it was sold, with the proceeds being used to build a new manse on the corner of Elizabeth and Robert Streets, Woodside.

The church building is now an ivy covered ruin and is threatened by continuing deterioration, but the adjacent cemetery is in good condition. The tombstones within the cemetery include those of a number of the early Scottish settlers — those of the Johnston family being of particular importance in relation to the development of the church, as well as the establishment of the two nearby towns — Woodside and Oakbank. The original portion of the manse is still identifiable and has a villa end with a corbelled gable and a loft door. The sandstone facade is still revealed, but its appearance is detracted from by later additions.


This group of buildings combine with the old Inverbrackie (Paynes) Hotel to form the centre of the Scottish settlement of Inverbrackie clearly reflecting the importance placed on religion and eduction

AREA FOUR - WOODSIDE

Woodside was laid out as a private township in 1856 by J. & W. Johnston. who had purchased the township section of 83 acres in 1850 and their public house, the Woodside Hotel, was possibly the first permanent structure to be erected in the town. However this has been extensively altered over the years and is no longer representative of the early settlement period. A total of 148 allotments were laid out in the original portion of the town and while the south eastern half of the subdivision was not developed during the nineteenth century, allotments near the Onkaparinga Valley Road were soon taken up. This area has continued to develop as a commercial precinct and most of the original buildings have been lost. The most important buildings remaining from this period are included within the police station and courthouse complex, the earliest portion of which was erected in 1859. During 1851-52 a Wesleyan Chapel was built on the south western side of the new subdivision and Saint Mark's Church of England was erected on the north eastern side. These are still relatively intact and, in association with their graveyeards and the larger churches built nearby, are of great local significance.

In the area behind the Main Street, there are a number of houses which reflect the development of the town during the last century, the most interesting of these being a row of three terraced cottages which were used as accommodation for the coach drivers who served the town during the period around the turn of the century, and which were possibly built as accommodation for mine workers during the 1880s. These are Nos. 11 Moffatt Street, Woodside. In 1858 the South Australian Company, who owned most of the surrounding area, laid out the adjoining subdivision of West Woodside, but once again there is little remaining evidence of the early settlement period. The character of the allotments facing the Main Street was established during the latter part of the nineteenth century when a number of substantial houses and commercial premises were constructed using an attractive pink sandstone, and although none of these buildings are of individual significance the stonework remains an important townscape element. Two other houses within West Woodside represent the social importance of stone as a building material during the period around the turn of the century. These identical houses use timber detailing to represent a cut stone facade with stone quoins, and in this sense are similar to the house on the workingmen's blocks near Oakbank in which a pressed metal facade was used to achieve the same effect.

AREA FOUR - WOODSIDE (Cont.)

Outside of these two major subdivisions the town development is scattered with possibly the most important building being the cottage at 106 Main Street, which appears to have been the local headquarters for the Adelaide to Woodside coach service from the early 1870s until the late 1880s.

thousands of gallons of milk daily to Adelaide. The S.A. Farmers Co-operative Union factory at Woodside was closed in the mid-1970's owing to a process of rationalization.

On-going development has altered the appearance of the site on a number of occasions, and the remaining buildings have deteriorated since the factory closed down - but the site is still significant as that of one of the earliest butter factories in the state. Established as the dairy industry began to increase in importance, it continued to operate for almost 90 years and was the major factory in the Woodside area during this period.

the rear of the cottage and a stone addition was built to one side. The layout of this extension suggests that it was used for separate accommodation — each of the two rooms having a fireplace and an external door. The rooms are linked together and one is connected with the remainder of the house. This part of the building is also constructed of random rubble, but brick detailing has been used around the window openings. Timber shingles remain under the galvanised iron to both parts of the dwelling.


This building illustrates some of the simple techniques used in the early stone cottages in the district - and was almost certainly used to accommodate coach drivers travelling between Adelaide and Woodside in the period from 1874 to 1887, stabling and pasture being provided on the adjoining land. It appears that this was a major coaching station in the district and is significant for its association with this service.

it became free of debt in 1898.

The original church was built of random stone with cut stone to the window heads, the end wall being rebuilt with squared sandstone after its collapse in 1854. Timber shingles still remain under the present galvanised iron roof and the building is currently occupied as a Sunday School. The second church, which was built of random stone with red brick detailing, was intended as a first stage only, but it was never completed — a model held in the church showing the original design. The group also includes the cemetery, and the sandstone wall with cast iron cresting which runs along the front of the property.

Two Anglican churches were built in the Onkaparinga district in 1851 (the other at Balhannah), but only the church at Woodside remains and it therefore represents the establishment of the Anglican Church in the district The second church on the site representing the development of this group and their expectations of continued expansion - expectations which were not fulfilled.

Lodge offered reduced rates and leniency, but the mortgage was eventually called in and the property sold to the Presbyterian congregation — the Inverbrackie church having proved to be inadequate.

St. Peters was renamed as the Presbyterian Church of St. John, and services commenced in early 1878 - the first minister being the Reverend John McBean, M.A. The Johnston family of Oakbank were important members of the congregation and they paid for the back pews on either side, while arranging that the other pews should be sold to the local members of the congregation.

The church was built of coursed, random, pink sandstone with rendered brick detailing. There are large buttresses along the side and rear walls, with a square porch tower to the principal facade - the heavy rendered detailing to the porch including a balustraded parapet and lancet recesses. The church is significant for its association with two of the important groups of settlers in the Onkaparinga district - the German Lutherans and the Scottish Presbyterians.

AREA FIVE OAKBANK

Section 4018 of the Hundred of Onkaparinga was settled by the Johnston family in 1840 and during the next decade (C1843) William and James Johnston established a brewery on this site. In 1850-1851 William and James subdivided part of this section as Oakbank, the south eastern portion of the town (Part Section 4020) being subdivided at a later date. The sale of allotments was slow and Oakbank retained the character of a private company town of which the major feature was the Oakbank Brewery. This is still owned by the family and although it is no longer used as a brewery, now producing only softdrinks, the complex is well preserved. The Johnston family was also responsible for erecting two elegant houses, one on either side of the town - 'Oakbank House' being occupied by James Johnston and 'Dalintober' by his brother Andrew Galbraith Johnston. Both of these have been well maintained and are elaborate nineteenth century villas.

In 1886 a second brewery, the Dorset, was erected in the town by Henry Pike and while brewing was discontinued in 1938, aerated waters were produced here until the 1970's. The site has since been split up, but the brew tower and cellars have been sympathetically converted to a residence and craft workshop. While there are a number of other early buildings in the town few are of individual merit, although together they contribute to the historic character of the townscape, which sadly has been marred by much unsympathetic development. Despite the significance of the breweries and the former Johnston family homes the town is best known as the location of the race meeting held each Easter at the Oakbank Racecourse. The site, then owned by the Johnston family, was first used for a race meeting in about 1867, and by 1874 this had become a well established annual event, with the now famous Great Eastern Steeplechase being run for the first time in 1876.

Close settlement was not a feature of this area which was mostly consolidated into large holdings by an early date. An example of this was Thomas Inglis' property of 'Sandy Water Hole' which, by the beginning of the 1870's, had been expanded to occupy over 1200 acres. However, as for many of the other larger properties in the district, the original homesteads have been either extensively altered or lost. By the 1880's 'Sandy Water Hole' had been divided up and one small corner of 7 acres then became the site of a cottage built with stone veneer walling – a technique which has not been commonly identified in this state. Surrounding this building, which is now in a state of disrepair, are several outbuildings from the same period and the small block is partially enclosed by dry-stone walling.


A number of small, stone cottages have survived within the scattered community around Murdochs Hill and these include some interesting examples from the early settlement period. An early point of focus within this community was the Wheat Sheaf Inn which was licenced between 1855 and 1863, its location being given variously as Manx Town and Inverbrackie. Only a low stone wall remains in an area in which the hotel is believed to have been located, but the other point of focus for the community is the primitive Methodist Church built at Murdoch Hill in 1866, which is still being used.


One of the most important items remaining in the Council district is the lime kiln and quarry complex established at Murdoch Hill by 1871. Under the direction of Samual Day this grew to supply a major part of the district with burnt lime until its closure in about 1915. Two large, dry-stone kilns used to burn stone from the adjacent quarries are still standing on the site, and the complex is an important remnant of a major early industry.

addition at the rear. Behind the house there is a timber slab structure with a stone fireplace at one end, and this has been lined internally with whitewashed hessian bags - all of which are still in good condition. It is likely that this building was the original kitchen.

The other early building on the site, is a small stone store in which a fine mud mortar has been used. This group displays a number of early building techniques - the most important of these being the use of timber slab-stone veneer. Although another house of this type has been identified at Kersbrook (Hundred of Talunga) we have not found any documentation about this method of construction.

The business grew to supply a major part of the district with burnt lime — at one time employing 37 people to quarry dolomite from the large pits which are still exposed on the property. To burn the lime two kilns were built side by side, the pits being dug into a cutting which was then faced with dry stone walling. Each of these pits were approximately 3.5m square by 7.5m deep and once filled with alternate layers of rock and timber they were tended for 10 days while the lime burnt — with up to 8 men feeding the kilns. The kilns were last used in about 1915, but although the burning pits have been filled in the face of the kiln is still in good condition.

The kiln and quarry are important evidence of a major early industry in the Onkaparinga district - being associated with the development of the area through the supply of large quantities of building lime.

AREA SEVEN - HAY VALLEY TO BONNEYS FLAT

This area, which is located at the southern end of the Council district was influenced both by the German settlement around Hahndorf and by the surrounding areas of English settlement. Verdun (originally Grunthal), developed as a subsiduary to Hahndorf during the 1840's and early 1850's, and the original layout of the subdivision is still identifiable. These long blocks which cross the Main Road and lead down to the river reflect some of the characteristics of the traditional hufendorf (farmlet village) layout, but also illustrate the modification of these traditions in view of the local conditions which demanded larger areas of farming land. The oldest remaining building in the town is the Stanley Bridge Hotel which was first licenced as the Fourth Hill Hotel in 1851.


Two examples of properties established by German immigrants are 'Ravenswood' and 'The Pines', both of which display an interesting range of building techniques and styles - the timber barn at Ravenswood being a particularly good example of the craftsmanship of the early German carpenters. Both of these properties have a large stone house, but during the early years of settlement many houses were built of locally made brick. Examples of half-timber houses with brick nogging have been found in the Lobethal area, but few examples of the early, solid brick houses have been identified within the study area. One example which is still relatively intact is 'Willow Springs' (formerly 'Daisy Hills') which was occupied by John Williams in as early as early as 1854.

During the 1840's an area known as Bonneys Flat was settled on the western side of Balhannah. This area had its own Methodist Church, built in 1859, but otherwise remained as an open farming district until the development of the Balhannah Mines.





a large timber-framed barn which has a threshing hall, two side aisles, and a loft to each bay. The timber details are typical of those found in the early German barns built in the nearby Hahndorf district (refer to G. Young et al. As a group, these buildings form an important farm complex which represents a number of early building styles and techniques. The buildings are generally in good condition and their location affords an attractive setting overlooking the Onkaparinga Valley to the west, and the Balhannah - Littlehampton Road in a valley to the north-east.







The original stone building is part of the present hotel, and although it has been extended on three sides the principal facade, is still exposed. This was built of random stone and has ruled joints and rendered detailing to match the later additions. Timber shingles remain under the galvanised iron roof, and these have been exposed internally. A new wing was added first at one end and later at the other, the vernadah linking the two changing the character of the building.

This is the only hotel in the district in which the original portion of the building has remained clearly identifiable through more than 130 years of continuous licencing. Its early commercial success (which is reflected by the high value of the property) is related to its position near the intersection between the main route to Mt. Barker and that through the Onkaparinga Valley, at a time when both of these areas were being opened up to intensive agricultural settlement.








AREA EIGHT LENSWOOD TO FOREST RANGE

This area was opended up as a timber cutting district during the late 1830's supplying large quantities of split timber for the building industry around Adelaide. Agricultural settlement was initially resisted by the dense scrub and the steepness of the terrain, and the early buildings in the district were mainly temporary structures erected by the timber collectors. At this time the area was known as 'The Tiers', but by the 1880's the name Forest Range had come into use, the Forest Range Hotel being first licenced in 1884. The lower range along the eastern boundary of this area was taken up as farming land from the 1850's, but even here there are few remaining buildings from the early settlement period.

It was at the beginning of this century that the Forest Range district developed a distinctive local building style - the use of 'pise' becoming common at this time. It is possible that this method was used at an earlier date - local residents recalling a number of simple 'pise' cottages which have since been lost, but most of those remaining were built between the late 1890s and the early 1920s. These range from what was originally a simple two room cottage to bungalow style housing, and although most have suffered some degree of deterioration there are still some good examples of this technique. Despite the extent of the early timber industry the ranges still include areas of dense scrub, and it is believed that these include some species of vegetation which are now rare. It is desirable that detailed surveys be conducted before these last areas are cleared.







AREA NINE WESTERN BRANCH

This area extends along the north western side of the Onkaparinga River between Balhannah and Woodside. The land rises from the river towards the Forest Range district and during the early years of settlement a large part of it was owned and leased out by the Adelaide Land and Gold Company. By the 1870s this large holding, occupying much of the central portion of the area under consideration, had been established as 'Vernon Park' and was therefore not subject to the close settlement evident elsewhere along the Onkaparinga Valley.

Tiers Road, which is located on the north eastern side of the original 'Vernon Park', defines the extent of the German settlement which took place on this side of Lobethal. This was an area of mixed settlement and while some German building techniques are evident, the remaining settlers cottages are typical of those built throughout the district at this time. The more substantial dwellings were built of stone and one of these, 'The Wattles' forms part of a relatively intact farmyard complex which includes a slab barn, milking shed and stable. The original portion of this house had been completed by 1854 and it is one of four stone cottages within the valley which remain from this period. Other examples of early cottages in the area were constructed with a timber frame between which rough stone and mud infil panels were supported by laths. In one case the walls were simply finished with an annual coat of whitewash, while in another the building was clad externally with weatherboards. One of the most interesting items in the area around Tiers Road is part of a simple timber framed cottage clad with galvanized iron. This was not built until about 1915, but it has an open kitchen fireplace, constructed of mud and stone, with a clay lined, timber slab chimney. This represents a technique used from the earliest years of settlement, but there are few remaining examples which are both still intact and in use.


On the south western side of 'Vernon Park' settlement was closely associated with Balhannah. There are two examples of larger residential buildings in this area, one an early two storey brick house and the other an unusual combination of a substantial stone dwelling built over a large storage area and stable. The two other tiems of interest are the old Glengyle Jam Factory, established in the 1880's and used until 1914, and the Emsdale Cider Factory, operated from a settlers cottage throughout the 1930's. Each of the latter represents the development of the area as a major fruit growing district.



The present galvanised iron roof conceals a well shaped shingled roof. A bricklined kiln which is built into the slope adjacent to the house, indicates the location of a lime burning kiln.

Around the turn of the century 'The Folly' was apparently used as a tannery by a Mr Lawrence, but it is now occupied as a house. It is therefore an interesting example of a building which has been used for both residential and industrial purposes, but more importantly it is unusual in South Australia for a substantial house to be combined with stables and farm storage areas in this way.



South Australian Centre for Settlement Studies cider. This was in response to the waste of considerable amounts of apples, which were unfit for export due to black spot and coddling moth. Initial attempts at producing cider under the guidance of an Austrian man, Mr Fraelich, proved unsuccessful, but advice given at a later date by a chemist, Mr Fornaschon, led to the production of a marketable drink - Elmsdale Apple Cider. Production of cider continued at the cottage throughout the depression years, but ceased during the Second World War due to the difficulty in obtaining items such as preservative and crown seals.

The equipment was then sold to Pikes Brewery at Oakbank and the cottage has since been developed as a family museum.

Apart from being an interesting example of an early stone dwelling this is also an important example of a small, local industry which was operating successfully throughout the depression years.

AREA TEN - WORKINGMEN'S BLOCKS

The creation of workingmen's blocks near Oakbank was part of a scheme, first introduced in 1855, which was intended to alleviate some of the problems faced by labourers with irregular or poorly paid employment. To achieve this, available public land was subdivided into small blocks, in this instance land which had been set aside for Aboriginal reserves. Tenants were expected to establish a degree of self-sufficiency.

Prior to subdivision in 1887 Sections 5001 and 5003 to 5005 of the Hundred of Onkaparinga had been set aside as Crown Land, having originally been nominated as an Aboriginal Reserve but the newly created blocks were only of small acreage and proved to be too small for their intended purpose, so they were leased in groups to form larger holdings. Although 21 year leases were issued to each occupier an apparent change in policy led to the sale of the individual holdings during the period around the turn of the century. A number of small cottages were built on the blocks and these represent some of the typical building styles and techniques which were used by the less affluent residents in the district at this time. An interesting item which is now in an advanced state of disrepair is a house, apparently built during the depression years, which was constructed of a poor quality timber frame with mud infil panels. This simple two cottage on Size Road was carefully lined throughout with salvaged oil tins which had been opened out and then neatly fixed to the timber frame.
