My father cherished it and its bird life. When the late Mr. Alick Melrose acquired the property (after S. Newland's death) he continued to bestow the same care on it and planted many native Australian trees and shrubs with his own hands....When he died it appeared likely that subdivision and housing would be its fate. However, Miss Ferguson, a very old friend and my patient, adopted my suggestion that she should purchase that portion of her uncle's estate. With the co-operation of his executors, and the devoted interest of her agent, this was achieved, the property at Miss Ferguson's wish becoming a public recreation reserve in perpetuity.

A codicil to Miss Ferguson's will bequeathed the property to the Crown and it was administered for over twenty years by the Govt. Tourist Bureau



It was under the partnership of Clark brothers and Joseph Crompton that the holding extended to 400 acres and in the 1870's Crompton bought out the Clark interests and took charge of the Home Park Winerv at Magill.

Henry Tyler was the winemaker then and H.M. Martin the accountant. In 1886 Henry Dunstan, then the manager of Dunstan Quarries (Stonyfell Quarries) acquired Stonyfell Vineyards and Cellars and by 1902 the Winery was known as H.M. Martin & Son Limited.

In 1950 Ronald Martin died. It is now a restaurant and small winery.

Description: Stonyfell House remained in the possession of the Crompton family until 1978, exactly 110 years since the rate assessment of 1868-69 showed that Joseph Crompton had enlarged the building that year to six rooms (plus the original three which formed an annexe to the main building) and had built a stable. Except for the lintel carved 1839, the annexe has been destroyed in recent extensive renovations to Stonyfell House; and the stable has been converted into a family home. Tucked down in a hollow by some willows on Stonyfell Creek, this little building rouses painful thoughts of beauty lost in the stone barns, stables, coachhouses and cowsheds of Burnside's rural past. Put up by local builders in the simplest fashion, the few survivors suit the taste and management capacities of today's families better than the mansions to which some of them belonged.



The sports field near Pembroke campus was originally part of an area known as Shipsters Paddock. This was a delightful recreation area for first generation Adelaidians. Football and Cricket was played by locals and less organised activities as slingshotting birds passed the time for many a young person. Children experienced displays of Aboriginal corroborees, 200-300 in number, and watched excitedly the training of horse Barber who is famed for swimming ashore from the wreck of the ship Admella. Barber went on to be the only S.A. representative in the first Intercolonial Champion horse race.

In 1865 the whole section of Shipsters Paddock was subdivided and the oval area was only saved by local co-operative effort; first a deposit then a mortgage paid by public subscriptions, concerts, football matches and so on. The oval was then used for Australian rules, cycling, during both wars the army used it and in 1964-65 under Mayor Bolton and Ron Aitken, President of the S.A. Amateur Athletics Association, it was altered to Olympic Sports Standards. Now it meets the needs of athletics, soccer, rugby union, school championship events and performing arts. October 1986 \$1.6m indoor recreation centre opened.
