PROJECT

Gordon Young, of the South Australian Centre DESCRIPTION: for Settlement Studies describes the building as an "example of true English wattle (teatree) and daub construction ... furthermore it has some design ... of a Scottish character particularly ... the back kitchen chimney". In fact the building, of mainly wattle and daub, was originally of 6 main rooms, with a wide front verandah, and was typical of a once common, but now most uncommon, design for a first generation British dwelling in South Australia.

HISTORY: The house was probably built prior to the wedding of Sarah Robertson, daughter of the structure's builder, in December 1855. In 1855 John Robertson was appointed Inman Valley's postmaster, and the house is said to have functioned as a post office. In 1869 the house was purchased by the Martin family and was part of a rich, rural history. Even in 1928 the house and its property were famed for its orange groves around South Australia.

This former dwelling is significant HERITAGE SIGNIFICANCE: not merely for its historical lineage, which is impressive, but more importantly for its architectural and constructional State elements. The structure exhibits qualities of transposed rural vernacular construction forms from Britain which are rare in South Australia.

Glacier Rock

DESCRIPTION: Smooth striated, grooved rock surface showing an indication of glacial action. Said to be Cambrian Kanmantoo Quartzite c.500 million years old which underwent glaciation c.250 million years ago.

HISTORY: This has been regarded as the first recorded discovery of glaciation in Australia, and was found by A.R.C. Selwyn in 1859 when he was contracted by the South Australian Government to undertake an economic geological survey of the colony. It was, in a sense, rediscovered by the eminent geologists Edgeworth David and Walter Howchin in 1897.

HERITAGE SIGNIFICANCE: Of immense value as a natural land-mark, but of great importance in the progress of colonial science in South Australia. David and Howchin were "giants" of their time, and their intense interest in the rock sparked off the public interest in it.

Bridge comprises 2, 9m spans with timber DESCRIPTION: decking carried on timber pier and 2 timber abutments. Approaches retained behind abutments and wing walls comprising vertical piles and horizontal wallings supporting vertical timber sheeting.

Opened in 1916 by Miss Anne Crossman it is an example of an understrutted timber bridge. The bridge is related to the work of Mr. Stevens, who was appointed in 1905 as engineer for roads and bridges.

HERITAGE SIGNIFICANCE: Of importance to South Australia's transport heritage, and associated with the period when localised bridge building was overseen by the Roads Department. The bridge shows a once frequent design using local timber.



Originally created in a natural basin, but fully engineered to carry in the vicinity of 130,000,000 gallons. The Reservoir wall is constructed of earth/rubble

HISTORY: Work commenced on the Reservoir in 1916 by Mr. Gow, an engineer of Scottish descent. It was completed in 1917 at a cost of £69,000. The water supply was needed to cope with influx of holiday makers and the increasing size of Victor Harbor's population. It is still renowned for the wattle-tannin taste its water has.

HERITAGE SIGNIFICANCE: A major historical statement on engineering history and relationship between European man and the environment. The need for water was of key importance. Further, the reservoir's design and overseeing by Gow, the Scottish engineer, is of importance in the study of the early 20th century public servants. Also important as an indicator of the impact of tourism on an area.

DESCRIPTION: A masterly construction of a parapet wall extending the perimeter of the Cut Hill section of road. Constructed of coursed, rough-faced, stone walling, with a breadth-ways uppermost course.

HISTORY: Constructed in 1868 as part of the reworking of the transport route to Victor Harbor. The wall's construction Hundred is attributed to Jabez Grimble under contract to the Central Roads Board. However, local historians claim that Grimble did not in fact finish the contract; the work being completed by another.

HERITAGE SIGNIFICANCE: A superb example of a parapet wall, with fine masonry techniques in evidence. Significant as a major statement of the impact of the Central Road Board's reconstruction of South Australian transport networks in the mid 19th century. A significant State landmark also, for generations of South Australian travellers.

DESCRIPTION: Designed on a relatively grand scale around a series of turrets and towers in a manner resembling Gothic architecture. However there is no consistent form to the building. S.H. Gilbert's National Trust description notes the building's stucco exterior walls but also calls it "reminiscent of a French Fantasy".

ITEM NAME:

Former or other

HISTORY: "Adare" was built by the Cudmore family in the 1890s. It epitomised, like Mount Breckan, the gulf between the wealthy, and the ordinary townspeople and visitors to Victor Harbor. In one sense too, it was a symbol of the wealth attained by some South Australian pastoral families.

HERITAGE SIGNIFICANCE: Certainly a unique item. Its most unusual design alone is important. However, its connection with the Cudmores, pastoralism, and South Australia's wealthy "elite", put it into a class shared by few South Australian late Victorian houses.



DESCRIPTION: Despite additions to this structure the original building is still evident, constructed of random stone walling and of simple rectangular form. The original chimney still stands.

HISTORY: Surrounded by as much historical legend and mystique as its Encounter Bay neighbour, The Fountain Inn, the original portion of this house supposedly dates pre-1840; i.e. according to local oral history. It was believed to be a centre for whalers and belonged to the Battye family for many years. From early paintings of the cove, c.1838, it is probable that the house is one of those featured.

HERITAGE SIGNIFICANCE: For its connection with South Australia's early whaling industry, and possibly the South Australian Company. This was the foundation point of the State's sea-going industry. The quality of masonry, and choice of stone, is of the highest and indicates wonderful vernacular construction techniques.



HISTORY: Built c.1837, supposedly as a rendezvous for whalers. However, over time the Inn served as a focus for the developing Encounter Bay District. In April 1856 the first meeting of the D.C. Encounter Bay was held there.

HERITAGE SIGNIFICANCE: For nearly 150 years this building has had series of romantic tales woven around its past. It is, next to the Bluff itself, a keen indicator of the life of the whaling industry and the growth of European settle-

Moreover, it is a fine example of vernacular building skills. Far more research needs to be done on the building's origins, as so much legend is connected with it.

DESCRIPTION: A monument in this cemetery marks the site of the first church building in Encounter Bay. Graves of the early settlers of this area still remain.

HISTORY: In 1839 the Rev. Ridgway Newland and a group of pious settlers established the settlement of Yilki, Encounter Bay. The Tabernacle Church was the centrepoint, and around it, a cemetery was created in the English tradition. The cemetery functioned from 1840-1941.

HERITAGE SIGNIFICANCE: A most important site; the one-time centre of activity for Ridgway Newland's flourishing settlement and pastorate. Moreover, the Yilki area was the epitome of what Wakefieldian theory hoped South Australian settlement would be like - the ordered model of a "Little England". A most significant part of cultural transmission history in South Australia and noted for its connection with the Newland family and South Australian religious history.



A series of connected structures, but with one central building from which the other lean-tos and sheds lead. The major building is constructed of pug and stone with a rendered exterior with ample use of galvanized iron. The structure shows many vernacular construction techniques.

HISTORY: No record came readily to hand on the date of inception of the butter-factory. However, Burgess proudly mentions its existence in his 1909 volume as "in addition to good business premises there are two mills and a butter factory". Again, its date of decline is uncertain.

HERITAGE SIGNIFICANCE: A really fine example of a late 19th century compact dairy industry constructed on the verge of a township in order to cater for the area's service needs. The former factory is in quite good condition. The examples of rural support industries in 19th century South Australia, especially of this town - support type, are uncommon. It was an unexpected survivor at Victor Harbor.

No longer used for its original lookout/fishing DESCRIPTION: use the Bluff is a dominant headland on the coastline covered in grass and low scrub, with several rock outcrops at the crest of the hill. The landward side is badly eroded. Man made elements include a wharf and road along the foreshore and Encounter Bay side of the Bluff.

HISTORY: The Bluff is associated initially with the ocean meeting of Flinders and Baudin in 1802. Next European contact came with the advent of whalers and sealers. From the first settlement of South Australia, the S.A. Company's whaling station was placed at the Bluff. The land was originally granted to Gov. Hindmarsh and then to his son, John. However, by the 20th century the Bluff achieved Government recognition as the hallowed spot of holiday makers

HERITAGE SIGNIFICANCE: The Bluff has great integrity with the USE State's past through its aesthetic, geological, and historical associations. Historically, it links with first settlement industry (whaling), shipping and then later, from the late 19th century, with tourism.



DESCRIPTION: This conservation park comprises West Island and LOCATION Seal Island, both of which are outcrops of Victor Harbor granite. West Island rises to 40 metres above sea level and the scattering process has resulted in the formation of large angular boulders and there is significant amount of soil on top of the island. There are no beaches on the heap of island. Seal Island is essentially a granite with no soil development. The whole islet would be covered by waves in very rough weather.

HISTORY: The history of these islands go back into Kaurna mythology. However, from a European settlement history point of view, in 1883 the contract for the building of the new Parliament House specified granite for the base. The Kapunda Marble and Building Co. established a small granite quarry on the northern tip of the island.

The importance of this site for HERITAGE SIGNIFICANCE: aesthetic and geological reasons is quite obvious. Historically, the park's tourist associations and connections with the construction of the "new" parliament house, give it importance.

Wood, for final design and building.

HISTORY: Designed and finally built in 1880 for Alexander Hay a wealthy merchant and pastoralist, and Member of the South Australian Parliament, the Adelaide City Council (from 1852) and the Central Road Board. Hay also built "Linden" on 65 acres of land at Burnside.

On 13 March 1872 after the death of his first wife, Hay married Agnes Grant Gosse. He built "Mount Breckan" as a gift for his new wife, on land he purchased from John Hindmarsh Jr. Hay demanded of the architect that he "provide a commodious structure in which social reunions might be held in gaiety and comfort". The completed building comprised 22 rooms, eighty foot tower and the main hall was 35' x 48'. The house burnt in 1909 but was rebuilt as an exclusive guest home, and has since served a variety of purposes.



PROJECT

DESCRIPTION: A basically rectangular, two-storeyed, design of the late-Victorian-Edwardian period. Constructed of stone walling with rendered brick quoins and surrounds to openings. The building's main facade is heightened by the addition of verandahs over two storeys with ornate lattice work.

HISTORY: By the early 20th century Victor Harbor had reached an unprecedented height as a holiday resort town. Even in 1893 the Adelaide newspaper Quiz & Lantern noted Victor Harbor's "attractiveness as a holiday retreat". This attractiveness has never diminished and "Warringa" has continued its Guest House existence.

HERITAGE SIGNIFICANCE: "Warringa" is part of the Railway Station precinct heritage. It has importance as part of the transport linked tourist service industry which became so important in Victor Harbor's rise to South Australia's pre-eminent holiday town.

DESCRIPTION: A reserve fronting the sea-shore and esplanade, with symmetrical plantings of pines and hedge-walled walk paths with rockeries and gardens laid out.

HISTORY: These gardens were constructed, initially in 1917, as a remembrance centre for Australian soldiers who died in World War. One. They immediately gained popularity as a "contemplative" retreat for tourists and have functioned as a foreshore focal point ever since.

HERITAGE SIGNIFICANCE: Australian historians, like Gammage, have argued persuasively that World War One was and is the great watershed of Australia's story as a nation. These gardens speak to that thesis, fervently. Moreover they have become a feature, linked in tourist minds, to the very concept of the Victor Harbor holiday atmosphere. Their structure within the foreshore layout is of prime importance to the heritage of Victor Harbor.

Constructed of coursed stone rubble, massive DESCRIPTION: timber roof structure, simple design, features 3 arched western entrance doors.

HISTORY: This goods shed is associated with the 1864 opening of the Victor Harbor-Goolwa railway. The first stage of this track was constructed eleven years previously and laid claim to being - not without dispute - the first railway in Australia. When the line reached Goolwa Port Elliot's harbour facilities were virtually abandoned and Victor Harbor became the port of the Murray trade.

HERITAGE SIGNIFICANCE: The goods shed's link with the quest by British settlers to open up transport and communication avenues is of the utmost importance. To conquer and ship rural produce through the Murray trade, to link seaboard towns to international routes and to make transport quicker and more efficient was behind the opening of the 1864 line. Of great significance to the State.



PROJECT

DESCRIPTION: A large rectangular design building of "transition" period. Roof gablets, projecting eaves with brace-bracketed verandah, plain bricked chimneys. Constructed of red brick with verandah.

HISTORY: Constructed in 1925 as an improvement to the services offered to holidaymakers by the Railways. It was designed by R.H. Chapman, the Engineer for Railways. The building is an integral part of the system begun in 1853 and extended to Victor Harbor in 1864.

HERITAGE SIGNIFICANCE: The building reflects the great increase in tourist traffic to Victor Harbor and the town's continued growth as the premier tourist resort of South Australia. It is also linked to the growth of transport and communication services.

Further, the building is a relatively rare example, in South Australia, of the rather austere American inspired utilitarian architecture of the 1920s. In this way it speaks of the switch from Euro-centric to American-centric social thought in the 1920s.



DESCRIPTION: A building of rectangular formation constructed of blue stone with painted brick quoining, a corrugated iron roof, and brick chimneys. A low verandah supported by wooden posts runs along the entire front, with a central front door and four sash windows.

HISTORY: Built in the 1860s as a custom's house and store, and possibly as a harbour master's dwelling (one local history, Strempel & Tolley, gives the date as 1867). In 1915 the land on which the building stands was handed over to the authority of the South Australian Railways.

HERITAGE SIGNIFICANCE: As a part of the State's maritime history, and through its connection with the Railway Station complex, this building is of great importance. It specifically relates to the earliest stages of Victor Harbor's port development.



HERITAGE SURVEY REGION

DESCRIPTION: A series of shipping and transport aids erected at various stages from 1862. What is now the causeway saw its first section constructed of timber in 1862 as a jetty and pier (removed), this stage was completed in 1864. The extension of this "colonial gum" jetty to Granite Island started in 1872 and the Causeway was completed in 1875. The next stage of screwpile and breakwater took place from 1878-1881. The breakwater is constructed of piled-random boulders. The screwpile jetty is an ingenious engineering feat secured by blasting 1m-2m holes and then screwing in threaded piles with wooden superstructure added.

Former or other

HISTORY: The relocation of a port for the Murray Trade from Port Elliot to Victor Harbor occurred c.1862. In July of that year work commenced on the first stages of the jetty which eventually was extended as a causeway to Granite Island in 1872. From 1878 tenders were called for the construction of a breakwater and screwpile jetty at Granite Island to facilitate trade. These were completed by 1881. However, the building of the Morgan-Kapunda railway in 1876 had stolen the port's future economic life.

HERITAGE SIGNIFICANCE: This complex of jetties, breakwater and cutting is full of unique engineering feats. Moreover, it is a fine indicator of the zealousness of Murray trade promoters and the push of Victor Harbor locals in an effort to secure a shipping point. A great statement of 19th century belief in trade and communications as a means of societal progress.


