HERITAGE SIGNIFICANCE

Johann Menge must be one of the most famous, indirectly one of the most influential and certainly the most unusual of South Australia's first European colonists. He arrived in the "Buffalo" in 1836 employed as a geologist by the South Australian Company. From 1837 this highly intelligent and eccentric man explored large areas of the new colony, usually quite alone and (unlike the more formal explorers) easily living off the land. His extensive mineral discoveries and his favourable reports on suitable farm land and water supplies influenced many other settlers - especially in the settling of the Lower North, and in particular, George Fife Angas and the German immigrants he had helped. His discovery and public izing of abundant minerals drew early attention, in particular to the colony's copper deposits, and Menge "acted as a catalyst SUBJECT to its development". (Barossa Historic Bulletin, p.13)

Menge lived a nomadic, frugal existence, his base for much of his time in South Australia being "Menge's Island" in the Barossa. He was established here by 1839, tried to sell Section 2750, "well known, and justly celebrated, as Menge's Island... " in 1842 and left in the early 1850s for the Victorian gold diggings, where he died in 1852.

His home at the junction of the two creeks, was a rich alluvial flat, which he cultivated and which he made an island by cutting a ditch from upcreek to a point downriver (the line of channel is still indicated on the ground by a dark strip of soil). His house was the cave, described as "very primitive. ... like the roof of a house set on the ground with one gable end closed and the other nearly so, leaving only sufficient room for entrance", around which were "heaps of minerals he had collected, waiting for cleaning and classification". HERITAGE SIGNIFICANCE

William Jacob came to S.A. as assistant surveyor to Col. Light in 1836 and took up land here when the Special Surveys were done in 1839. He had built a substantial house and outbuildings by 1850. A large slate roofed house in disrepair appears to date from this period. He was one of the first settlers to plant vines (1854) and to make wine (1859). The cellars may have been built at this time. The cellars were added to and improved before 1891.

The winery became C.F. Cleland and Co. Ltd. in 1888 (Jacob amalgamated), but this folded in 1916, the winery was sold and the cellars not used again for wine-making.

The cellars were converted to a restaurant in 1972 by Colin Gramp.





HERITAGE SIGNIFICANCE

This farm complex has remained in largely original condition and Henschke family ownership since its establishment in the early 1850s until purchased recently by Martin Dallwitz. The property is a very good representative example of the development of a Barossa Valley German farm. Remains of the earliest living quarters survive in a straw roofed implement shed while the later substantial stone home is in excellent condition having undergone extensive sympathetic restoration by the present owner.

HERITAGE SIGNIFICANCE

The large wine-making concern of Seppelts expanded between 1910 and 1920 by buying new wineries or developing other sites (than at Seppeltsfield). The Dorrien winery was built in 1911 next to the railway line at "Seppelts' Siding", constructed "very much after the style of the original winery at Seppeltsfield". This building was partly demolished in 1979 but it remains a substantial structure, together with the characteristic palm trees and castellated storage tanks.

HERITAGE SIGNIFICANCE

First owner Heinrich Ahrens, of whom the present owner Mr. Ray Lehmann is a descendant.

The original owner arrived in S.A. in 1837 as an employee of the South Australian Company, then joined Colonel Light's surveying party. Ahrens bought this land at Vine Vale in about 1842 and built a small home when he married in that year. Then in 1853, he built the existing stone steep-roofed house. The back section may have been added later. The Ahrens would have grown wheat on the land; and also would have kept cows, pigs and fowls; later some grape vines. The holding was 200 acres, which he probably originally bought from Angas, because the land was initially part of Angas Park. The house is described locally as the first two-storey house in the Barossa Valley.



Vine Vale was settled (as Angas Park) from about 1840-1841 by German immigrants. J.S. Stiller is listed as the occupier of 20 acres of land in the Bethany district in 1848. HERITAGE SIGNIFICANCE

In 1842 a party of 28 families founded Bethany (at first "New Silesia") on land owned by George Fife Angas and known as "Angas Park".

This small German styled house is of particular interest as the home of Carl Heinrich Thiele, one of the two trustees who purchased the Bethany settlement land from Angas in 1852 on behalf of the community.

Although in disrepair the house is a good example of its type and its association with Thiele makes it highly significant in the development of the now famous Bethany village.




