Recommendation: State

Description:

Random rubble stonework lighthouse with dressed surrounds and concrete extension. Light constructed in metal and cast iron. Has several adjacent stonework outbuildings with gable ends and corrugated iron roofs.

Historical Summary:

Constructed in 1883 as the 14th major navigational aid along the South Australian coast. The stone buildings were amongst the first in the "Iron Triangle". The building materials were shipped to the site. The tower was raised by 25 feet in 1908-9 as a result of shipping accidents.

Significance:

The lighthouse would have been an important aid for the grain ships using Port Augusta. As Port Augusta and Whyalla became industrial ports, so the lighthouse would have been as equally as valuable as an aid.

Random rubble stonework cottages with brick quoins. Hipped corrugated galvanised iron roofs and brick chimneys. Concave verandahs are built in (asbestos cement). Multi-paned, double hung sash windows and fanlights to doors. Asbestos cement leantos at rear. Cottages surrounded by stone walls incorporating outhouses.

Historical Summary:

The exact date is unknown, but they would probably have been built about the same time as the lighthouse.

Significance:

They are an integral part of the lighthouse complex, providing accommodation for the lighthouse keepers.

Rendered concrete section facing Gay Street with rendered surrounds, Gable ended corrugated galvanized iron roof to main hall. Modern windows to front elevation with semi-circular fanlight to front entrance. Several brick addition to side elevation. Concrete was made out of cement mixed with salt water

Historical Summary:

When the first little hall of 1905, built of timber and iron became too small, a public meeting in April, 1916 was held to consider formation of an Institute Association committee. In 1919 steps were taken to erect a new building. It was opened 3 November, 1920. First floor of roof removed in 1967, due to unsafe condition.

Significance:

The second hall built for the town's cultural and social venues.

Historical Summary:

It was erected by B.H.P. to house employees engaged in the haulage (by tramway) of iron ore from Iron Knob to Whualla. Mr. G. Hill and his family were the last tenants. It was given to the National Trust when threatened with demolition. It was moved to the National Trust Museum in 1978.

Significance:

Whyalla's oldest cottage and the only remaining example left of homes first built by B.H.P. for its employees.

The Nicolsons took out a 288 square mile lease in the area in 1919. The rear part of the homestead built between 1910 - 1920. The Nicolsons added stone rooms to the front when they took over ownership. The National Trust took over the building in 1969.

First taken up about the time Hummock Hill (later known as Whyalla) was being developed.

Defence authorities decided it was essential that steps be taken to defend the town's industry. The early fortifications were built by B.H.P. workmen. The majority of the work was done by gunners of the 26th Heavy Anti Aircraft Battery under the supervision of the 65th Deputy Commander Royal Engineers who arrived in Whyalla on 14th February 1942.

Significance:

The defence of B.H.P. operations in Whyalla was crucial, as R.N. ships were being built here by B.H.P. as well as the iron ore flux being mined in the vicinity.

The tramway is 33.5 miles long from Whyalla to Iron Knob and was not only the first railway track to be built on the Eyre Peninsula, it was company owned. Jetty and tramway construction together with related costs, cost B.H.P. £66,888. The jetty was built to be 900 feet long and was extended around 1912 to be 2,400 feet long and fitted with conveyor belts.

A company owned jetty and tramway which were the first major part of the B.H.P. complex to be constructed at Whyalla.

IN 1938 a significant impetus was the construction of the blast furnace followed by the decision for the establishment of a shipbuilding yard, initially to provide ships for the Royal Australian Navy in the form of patrol boats.

Significance:

B.H.P. operations in Whyalla created a "one industry town" where its fortunes are totally dependant on the Company's successes or failures.


