## HERITAGE SIGNIFICANCE

In 1865 German families began to settle in this locality, known as Sichem; near Sec. 151 (Balaklava Cemetery) and Sec. 153 (Fry suicide/murder). The cemetery is all that remains of this German settlement in the Sichem area. The first burial at the cemetery was in 1868.

The name Sichem was given by one of the first settlers, Ernst Traegar; the well still appears on some maps. Traegar first leased 500 acres from Samuel Mills. Several families, whose names later appeared in other parts of the area, first settled at Sichem, as the Cemetery attests: e.g. Anders, Hoepner, Keller, Schmerl.

## HERITAGE SIGNIFICANCE

This is a characteristic twentieth century feature of many country towns, like the wheat silos, dominating the sky-line. The Owen tower is a good example. The 120 foot concrete tower was built in 1942 by contractor, Ivan Wall. It was designed to bolster Owen's water supply, both in pressure and quantity, which it still does. Its capacity of 100,000 gallons is replenished each night by a pumping station some distance away.

## HERITAGE SIGNIFICANCE

Initially, this site was simply a siding on the Hamley Bridge - Balaklava railway line, the main railway station being at Stockyard Creek. However, by 1906 the mallee root trade was booming as the mullenised roots were being easily pulled out by farmers and railed to Adelaide as firewood. The activity in the Owen railway yard resulted in its status being lifted to a Railway Station. The Station building dates from c.1906.

The adjacent silos and bulk handling facilities attest to the significant role of the railway in the transport of grain. The existing early barley silos were built in the 1960s, and the later one doubled the storage space.

## HERITAGE SIGNIFICANCE

The old "Erskine Park", once known as "Wakefield Farm", homestead was built on what was originally a huge run held by Anstey and Giles, from the 1840s, who still owned this section until the 1860s. It is said that the present house incorporates a four-roomed boundary hut. If so, this would probably date from the 1860s. The property was subsequently owned by Nicholls Brothers, who sold it in 1881 to Benjamin Ragless. Some extensions to the building would have been made by Ragless as it was used as his homestead for 6,630 acres. There is still a thatched roof under the iron.

The building was renamed and transformed by a later owner, Alfred West, who added the tower and the ballroom in the 1920s. In 1923 West's horse, "Erskine", bred at "Erskine Park", was presented to King George V as a gift from S.A.

The homestead, situated close to the River Wakefield, is presently uninhabited.

## HERITAGE SIGNIFICANCE

Frederick Lake, Warnes' grandfather came to the property in 1913, and probably sank the well then.

The well is circular, stone-lined, with some timber lining at the top. The well bucket is still on the property. A stone tank and trough stand beside the well. It once had a tank mounted on it. Until about 1970 there was an old windmill from above the well.

The timber lining probably dates from the days of the windmill; and the bucket from the horse drawn or 'windlass' days. The well is about 6 foot in diameter, and still holds water.

During the 1914 drought the farmers from the Wakefield came here to collect water.

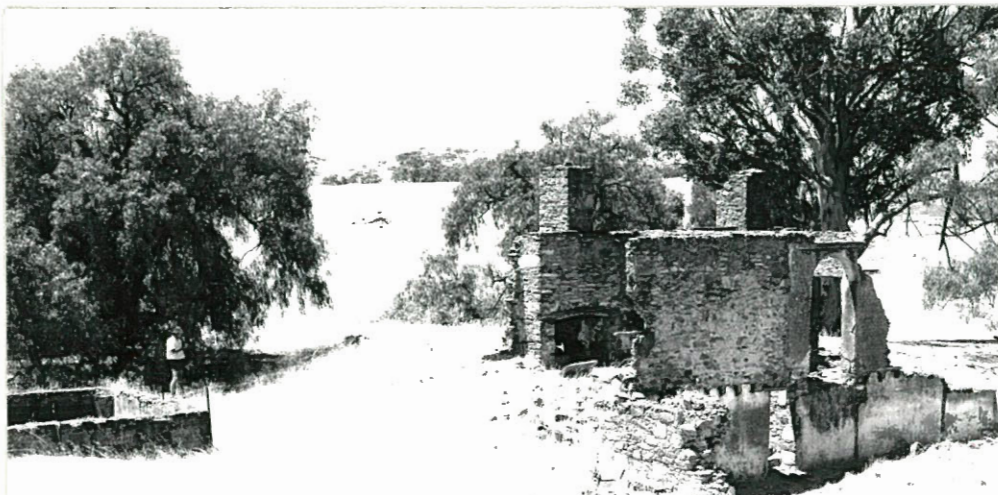

## HERITAGE SIGNIFICANCE

Homestead: The attractive "Monta Flora" homestead represents the culmination of years of hard work and the accumulation of assets by the original owner, David Smyth. Many settlers, Smyth among them, started in a small way by leasing land from larger landowners, then gradually buying sections as they could. Smyth leased and worked this and other sections from 1859/60, beginning his purchases in 1863. (S.43 in 1866/7). The first house was a cottage (see separate sheet); as Smyth consolidated his holdings the more substantial house was built (named after his wife, Flora).

This large stone house of 17 rooms, with decorative iron lace was constructed between 1879 and 1882 by Munro, a builder from Kapunda. It included a slate tiled cellar, servants' quarters and an underground tank under the kitchen. It cost £2,500 to build, a large sum for that time.

Massive Moreton Bay Fig trees stand at the entrance to "Monta Flora", which has been well-maintained by its present owners, still members of the Smyth family.

Cottage: David Smyth started working this land under lease from 1859/60, living in a tent until he had purchased the land. (See also "Monta Flora"). He purchased this section in 1866/7 and built his family this pug and pine cottage by the Salter's Springs Creek. It was built in a "U" shape with the dining room in one limb, kitchen in the other, joined by lounge and bedrooms, which opened onto a courtyard. The external wall of the kitchen and scullery was of stone. Some of the floors were of imported tiles and the roof was iron. In 1868 the house was valued at £20 - quite a contrast to the subsequent family homestead, costing £2,500.

The Church of Christ Chapel was built in 1862 at Alma, which was centrally located on the black grass plains being taken up at that time by farmers. ## HERITAGE SIGNIFICANCE

The Alma Hotel was built in 1871 on their own property by Joachim (Heinrich, J.) and Christina Hoepner. The Hoepner family had moved to the area in 1864 to a tiny settlement called Corconda, which did not survive the growth of the nearby town of Hamley Bridge.

As was usual with such buildings, the Hotel played an important community role; for example, Pastor Oster for a time conducted Lutheran services there.

After Joachim's death in 1882, Christina and her daughters continued the business. Christina also acted as midwife in the Hamley Bridge district. She died in 1896 and the hotel was subsequently (probably in the 1920s) converted to a house, which is described in 1928 (Ziegler) as "a fine, solidly built residence of modern type", on the "Corconda" property.

## HERITAGE SIGNIFICANCE

The brick stack and surrounding rubble make a significant industrial archaeological site. This is one of only a few remaining brick kiln relics in the Region.

The brick kiln was established on the bank of the River Light by H.J. Charlton and Co. in 1877. It was taken over by a prominent businessman John T. Quinn, who "literally built early Hamley Bridge" and in c.1916 was bought out by W.H. Durdin who operated the kiln until it was closed down c.1938. The clay deposits were limited and a small number of sand stock bricks were fired in a single down-draught kiln. The bricks were used in the constuction of a large number of buildings in the town and surrounding districts.

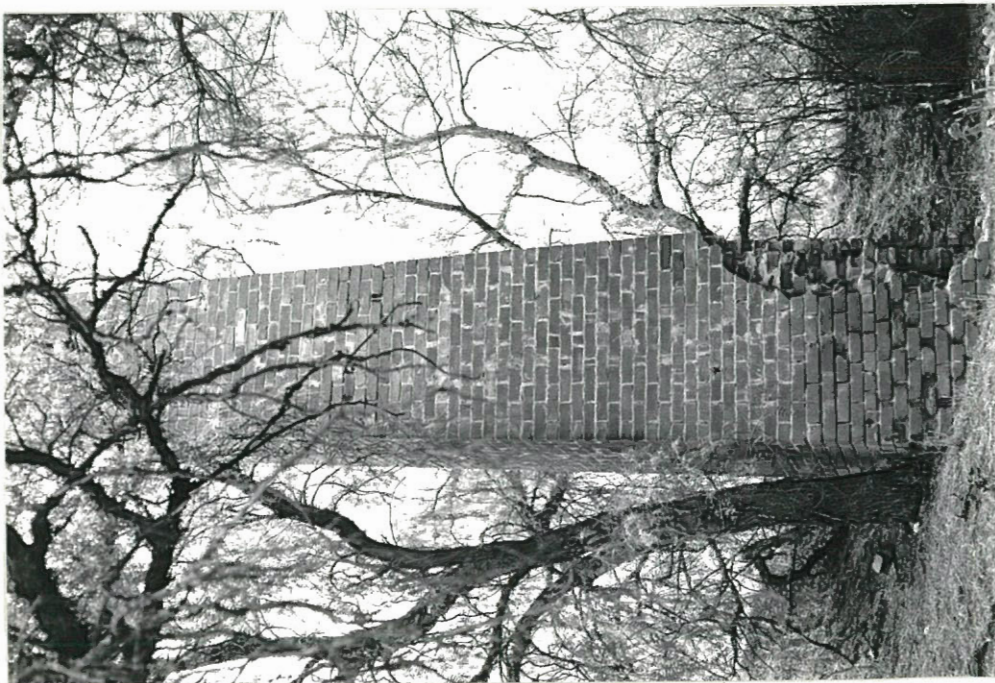

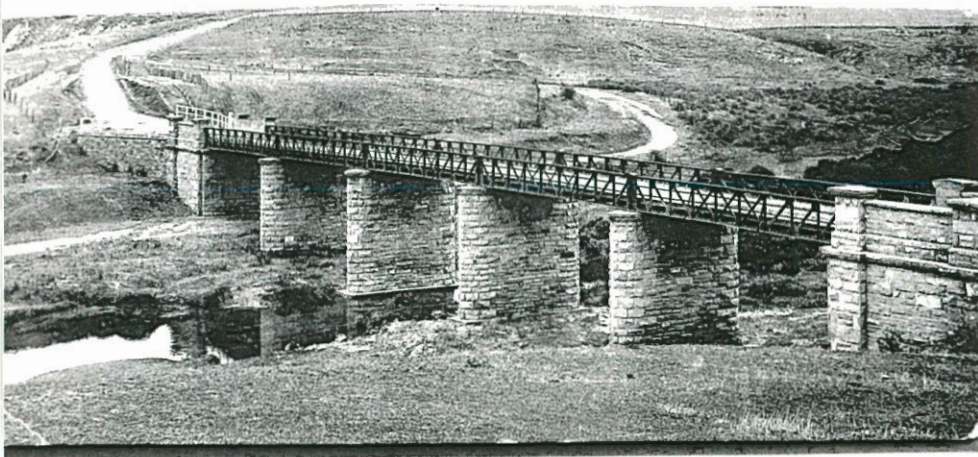

This two storeyed hotel was originally erected as a single storeyed building (as shown in the archival photograph).

The Hamley Bridge Hotel was built c.1871, as the licence was granted in June 1871. Initially, it was a single storey building. A second storey was built during the railways expansion of the early 1880s.

This was one of two hotels built next to each other (the second hotel, the Dublin has been demolished), and as close as possible to the railway station. The reason for this was due to the number of railway passengers who passed through Hamley Bridge. This was particularly so after the completion of the narrow gauge line as "a large passenger traffic sprang up between Moonta and Broken Hill on account of them both being mining towns, and it was necessary for such passengers to stay overnight in Hamley Bridge", which was at the break-of-gauge.

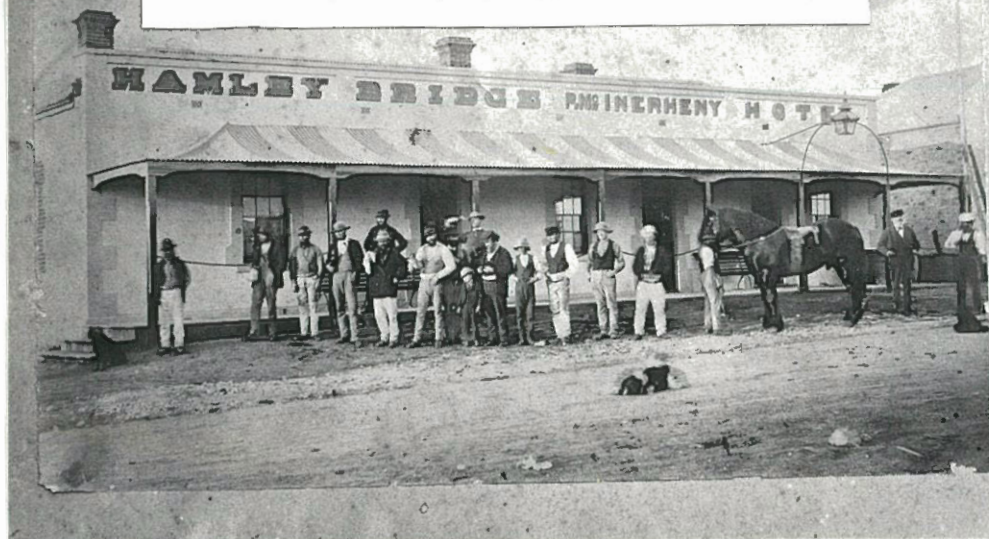

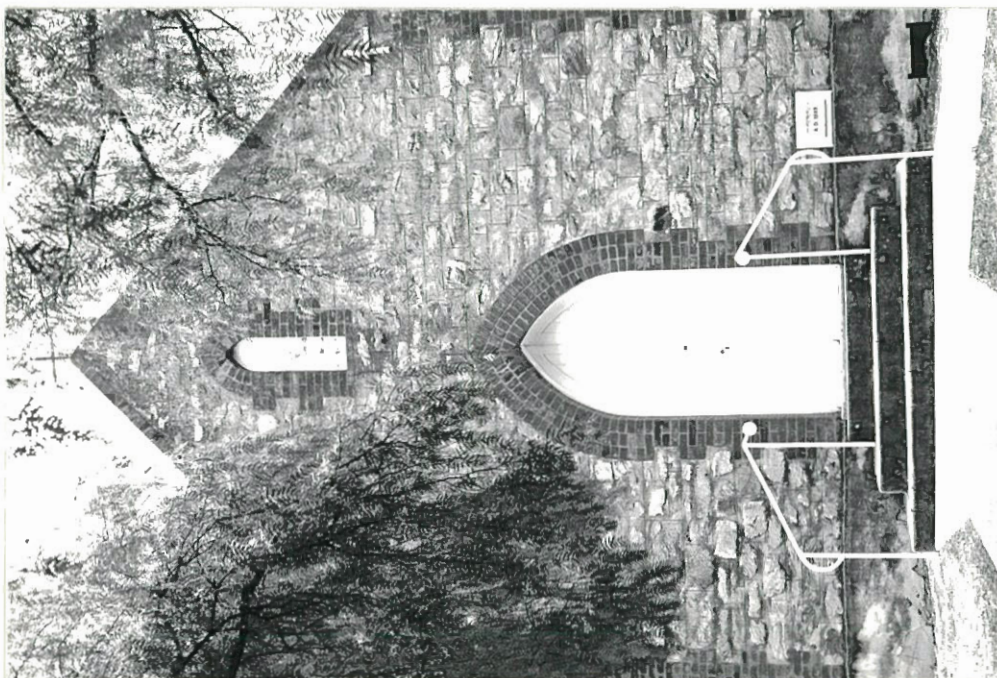
