RECOMMENDATION: State

Description:

Large house of random coursed stone with dressed stone quoins to corners and doorways with panelled doors surrounded by sidelights and fanlights. Many flat-roofed bay windows with single-paned sash windows. Corbelled chimneys to hipped corrugated iron roof.

Built for an English gentleman, George Affleck, who took the name of Danby in order to obtain an estate. This was his third fortune, and his improvidence may account for a planned second floor never having been added to "Lakeside". Danby imported English craftsmen for the building, which was modelled on an Affleck mansion in England.

RECOMMENDATION: State

#### Description:

Gabled building with skillion roofed section at rear, of random coursed squared rubble with stone quoins, elliptical brick-arched doorway with timber lattice above door, small louvred and sash windows to gabled ends. External stair to loft, which is said to be a gangway from an unidentified wreck.

No Heritage Item in the South East is complete without timbers from a shipwreck, an aperture through which Aborigines were shot at, and a room in which Adam Lindsay Gordon slept and/or wrote poetry.

#### Description:

T-shaped building with parapet gabled roof and lean-to at rear. Walls of tuck-pointed coursed random rubble with brick quoins, corbelled copings to gable and corbelled brick chimney. Six-paned sash windows semi-circular arched fanlight over double doors, circular attic vent.

Used until 1888 as a Customs House and Office of the Harbourmaster and Receiver of Wrecks for the South Eastern Coast. Was then for 80 years the Office of the Robe District Council. Marked for demolition but saved by the National Trust.

## HERITAGE SIGNIFICANCE

RECOMMENDATION: State

Description: Remnants of stone walls with corbelled parapet wall.

Built largely by local masons such as George Hailes, Levi Cooper and Sandy Park. Noted for its ornamental features. Served as a gaol until 1881 when prisoners were transferred to Mount Gambier. Much of the structure was torn down for road metal. 'Originally intended to serve the whole of the Lower South East it became redundant as the inland population grew and the ports declined.' (A. Barrowman).

#### Description:

Two storey gable roofed building with projecting hipped roof hexagonal bays. Random coursed rubble walls with segmental arched four-paned sash windows at ground level, shallow pointed arch window above, fanlight and sidelights to central door. String course at mid-height, gable vents either side of chimney, corbelled eaves. Timber clad upper level lean-to between projecting bays. Various single storey gabled and mono-pitched additions.

Built as the summer residence of Henry Jones of "Binnum", but he lost it because of his financial improvidence. Governor Sir James Fergusson used it as a summer residence c.1870. Later occupants were H. Dutton of "Anlaby", George Riddoch of "Koorine", and his grand-daughter Adelaide Napier.

Two storey inn of limestone walls with long corrugated iron gabled roof. Dressed stone quoins to five-paned casement windows at regular intervals. Building heavily covered by ivy.

Built for Peter McQueen in 'an ideal position ... one would say, to capture the trade of both town and villages' (K. Bermingham). Said to be the meeting place of Adam Lindsay Gordon and his future wife, Maggie Park. Became in 1887 an Anglican Parsonage, then in 1899 a private summer residence.

Description:

Simple gabled roof structure of rendered stone with pointed arch windows and entrance door, with fanlight above. Smaller gabled schoolroom extension at rear with stone chimney. Renewed pressed metal tiled roof.

The first religious structure in Robe. The stone was quarried at "Richmond Park". Had a chimney because the church doubled as a school from 1866 to 1880, the sisters being of the Order of St. Joseph.

Description:

Pair of attached hipped roof buildings of coursed rubble with segmental stone arches over six-paned casement windows, and regularly spaced doors with three-paned fanlights over. Street facades have been partially repaired, but the rear of the building is in a very dilapidated state.

Known as the 'Bush Inn' in 1862, then 'Mac's Hotel' in 1863. The license of 1865 was George Kendle from "Murrabinna", who built "Dingley Dell". After being unlicensed for many years it became the home of the Berminghams, and Robe's premier historian spent her childhood there.

Description:

Pyramidal-shaped landmark of rendered stone with plinth at base. Painted in red, orange and white bands. Timber lintel over tapered doorway to storeroom inside.

The Harbour Master, Capt. Thomas Lipson, suggested an obelisk for the Cape. The contractor who eventually built it was the third, two earlier contractors having apparently been deterred by the difficulty of the site. It was painted in alternate red and white bands in 1862 to make it more visible. At one time rocket equipment was stored in it as a lifesaving measure. An unfounded legend has it used as a place of solitary confinement for the prisoners of the Robe Gaol.

#### Description:

Simple L-shaped building comprising attached cottages. White painted rendered stone walls with double five-paned casement wiundows to Smillie Street elevation, four-paned sash windows to Cooper Street elevation, arched doorways. Hipped roof of flat iron with rolled laps, stone chimneys protruding from ridges.

Although called the 'Old Barracks' they were never so used; confusion resulted from the real barracks having been nearby, and from the appearance of the Ormerod Cottages. 'The four cottages, forming a terrace, were built to house the necessary personnel of a young and growing town, the activity of which was centred around the Shipping House of Ormerod & Co.' (K. Bermingham). Early occupants included a lawyer, a doctor, an accountant, a school teacher and a gaoler; later occupants were the staff of Sir James Fergusson when he stayed at "Karatta".

Large gabled residence of random coursed rubble, solid stone flat arches to multi-paned casement windows, scalloped gable barge and verandah fascia, raked verandah roof.

Built for the merchant George Ormerod. Sold in 1872, with the shipping business, to the John Grices. Transferred with this firm to Hutchison and Dunn. Andrew Dunn lived there till his death in 1901, after the collapse of the family fortune. Miss Alexandrina Hutchison later bequeathed it to the Church of England, who used it as a rectory. Returned to private ownership in 1939.

Edward Stockdale, after ten years of pastoralism in Victoria and Van Dieman's Land, established "Lake Hawdon" in 1848. As well as cattle, he bred horses, at which he had great success, selling in Australia and India. Famous rough riders also gathered at the station, including Tommy Hales and Adam Lindsay Gordon. In 1864, having been discouraged by failed horsebreeding experiments, Stockdale had turned his attention to sheep, and he sold this eastern part of "Lake Hawdon" to Thomas Magarey.
